



## **LEGISLATIVE NEWS**



#### Legislative Affairs Officer Brian Lange & Louise Bentley

#### **April 2019 Legislative Report**

There are some changes going on with ABATE's Legislative position. Most of you know that Brian Lange has stated that he would be stepping down as State LAO due to personal circumstances. In order to keep our legislative momentum going forward, I have agreed to accept the State LAO position. Brian has agreed to act as co-LAO, for which I am (and I'm sure most others are) very grateful.


We are now into the second half of the biennium for the legislative session of 2019-20. Our Vulnerable User Bill passed through the legislature and was signed by the

governor. This is the only one of our bills to pass this session. The house version of the Motorcycle Parking Bill did not pass out of the Senate due to political gamesmanship of one Senator who opposes ABATE. Our other bills: Lane Sharing, Helmet Choice and Weight Fee did not pass either. Over the next few months the legislative strategy for the next session will be organized and presented at upcoming meetings.

Several suggestions have also been made to streamline legislative efforts and bring some consistency to how the State LAO receives information from both ABATE members and external sources.

A bill, HB1014 (which was not an ABATE sponsored bill) did pass into law requiring all motorcycles driven on roads to carry liability insurance. This law goes into effect July 28th. Keep in mind that riding a motorcycle without insurance after July 28, 2019 can result in a fine as much as \$450. Please evaluate your insurance policies to safeguard yourselves - and, as always, ride safely!





From KEN NYLAND, ROAD CAPTAIN



Some of these suggestions include handouts with stop addresses, route direction, rally site locations and contact numbers. I will not ask anyone to push out and road block since it is not a safe way of doing business. Instead I will rely on providing good information and road safety tips for all riders prior to and during the ride. Let you know next month how it works out. Always remember that the road may be the same but the journey is always different.




