GOSPEL: St. Mark 11:1-11

☐ This week, the center of Jesus' holy catholic church's year, is one of striking contrasts: Today Jesus rides into Jerusalem surrounded by shouts of glory, only later this week to be left alone on Holy Thursday, and to die on Good Friday on His cross, abandoned by even His disciples. St. Mark's Gospel presents Jesus in His complete human vulnerability: celebrated, agitated, grieved, forsaken, yet ultimately eternally celebrated. Though we lament Jesus' suffering and death, and all human suffering and death, we also expect Jesus' resurrection salvation: celebrated in Holy Baptism and Holy Communion bread and wine. Jesus' Gospel promises that His death and resurrection mark a new covenant with all people. We enter this Holy Week in triumph with Jesus hungering and thirsting for the completion of Jesus' astonishing salvation.

☐ ¹When they were approaching Jerusalem, at Bethphage and Bethany, near the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two of his disciples ²and said to them, "Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately as you enter it, you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden; untie it and bring it. ³If anyone says to you, 'Why are you doing this?' just say this, 'The Lord needs it and will send it back here immediately.'" ⁴They went away and found a colt tied near a door, outside in the street. As they were untying it, ⁵some of the bystanders said to them, "What are you doing, untying the colt?" ⁶They told them what Jesus had said; and they allowed them to take it. ⁷Then they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their cloaks on it; and he sat on it. ⁸Many people spread their cloaks on the road, and others spread leafy branches that they had cut in the fields. ⁹Then those who went ahead and those who followed were shouting, "Hosanna! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! ¹⁰Blessed is the coming kingdom of our ancestor David! Hosanna in the highest heaven!" ¹¹Then he entered Jerusalem and went into the temple; and when he had looked around at everything, as it was already late, he went out to Bethany with the twelve.

PASSION SUNDAY GOSPEL: St. Mark 14:1-15:47
(To Be Read From Home Scripture)

FIRST LESSON: Isaiah 50:4-9a

L The suffering servant of the Lord God expresses absolute confidence in his final vindication, despite the fact that he has been struck and spit upon. This characteristic of the suffering servant played an important role in the early holy catholic church's understanding of the suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus.

L ⁴The Lord GOD has given me the tongue of a teacher, that I may know how to sustain the weary with a word. Morning by morning he wakens—wakens my ear to listen as those who are taught. ⁵The Lord GOD has opened my ear, and I was not rebellious, I did not turn backward. ⁶I gave my back to those who struck me, and my cheeks to those who pulled out the beard; I did not hide my face from insult and spitting. ⁷The Lord GOD helps me; therefore I have not been disgraced; therefore I have set my face like flint, and I know that I shall not be put to shame; ⁸he who vindicates me is near. Who will contend with me? Let us stand up together. Who are my adversaries? Let them confront me. ⁹It is the Lord GOD who helps me; who will declare me guilty?

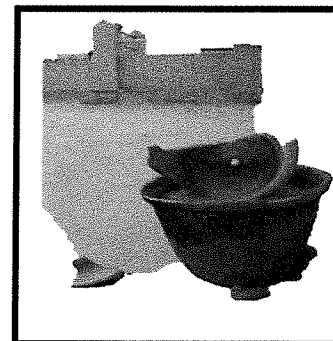

PSALM: Psalm 31:9-16

Into your hands, O LORD, I commend my spirit. (Ps. 31:5)

- ⁹Have mercy on me, O LORD, for I ¹am in trouble;
my eye is consumed with sorrow, and also my throat ¹and my belly.
- ¹⁰**For my life is wasted with grief, and my ¹years with sighing;
my strength fails me because of affliction, and my bones ¹are consumed.**
- ¹¹I am the scorn of all my enemies, a disgrace to my neighbors, a dismay to ¹my acquaintances; When they see me in the street ¹they avoid me.
- ¹²**Like the dead I am forgotten, ¹out of mind;
I am as useless as a ¹broken pot.**
- ¹³For I have heard the whispering of the crowd; fear is ¹all around;
they put their heads together against me; they plot to ¹take my life.
- ¹⁴**But as for me, I have trusted in ¹you, O LORD.
I have said, "You ¹are my God.**
- ¹⁵My times are ¹in your hand;
rescue me from the hand of my enemies, and from those who ¹persecute me.
- ¹⁶**Let your face shine up- ¹on your servant;
save me in your ¹steadfast love."**



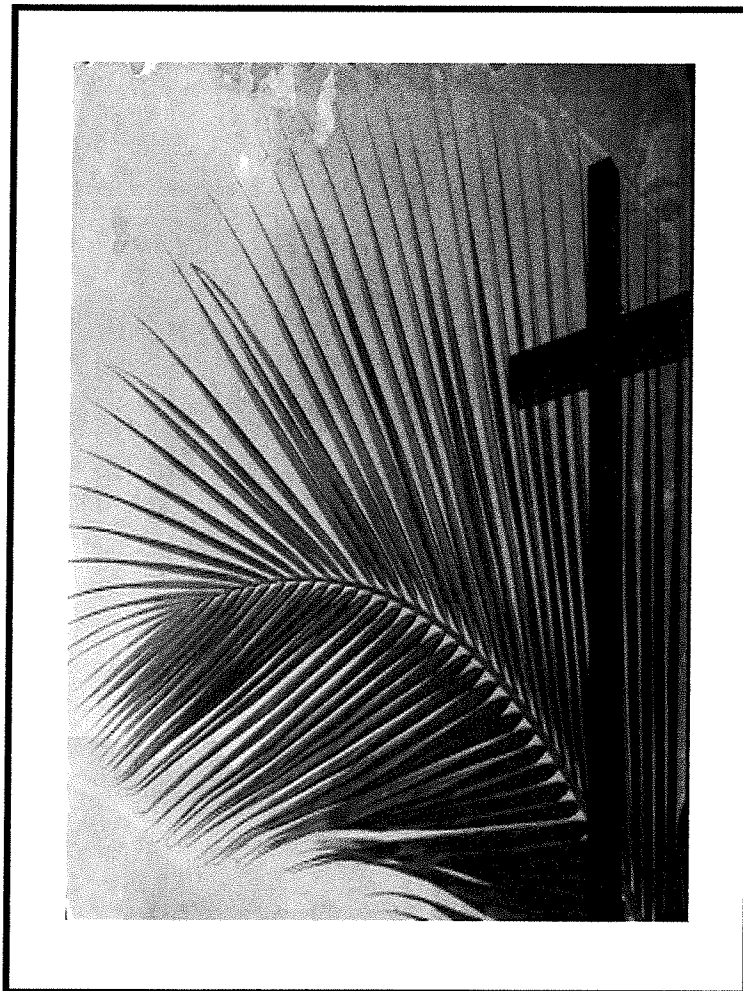
SECOND LESSON: Philippians 2:5-11

L St. Paul uses an early Christian hymn to help us comprehend Jesus' obedient selflessness on His cross and how God our Father has made His Son Jesus Lord over all. The perspective of Jesus' cross and empty tomb become the way we rightly understand God our Father, Jesus, The Holy Spirit, our own lives, and fellowship within the Body of Christ.

L ⁵Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus, ⁶who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, ⁷but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness. And being found in human form, ⁸he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death—even death on a cross. ⁹Therefore God also highly exalted him and gave him the name that is above every name, ¹⁰so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, ¹¹and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

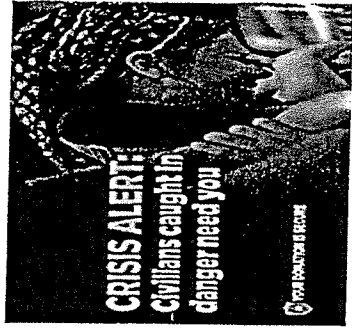
