

### GOSPEL: St. John 10:1-10

- L Jesus uses an image familiar to the people of His day to make a point about spiritual leadership. Those who listen to Jesus are led to abundant life.
- L Jesus is crucified and risen! Alleluia!
- G Jesus is crucified and risen indeed! Alleluia!
- L The Holy Gospel according to St. John the 10th chapter.
- C Glory to you, O Lord.
- Legate said: "Very truly, I tell you, anyone who does not enter the sheepfold by the gate but climbs in by another way is a thief and a bandit. The one who enters by the gate is the shepherd of the sheep. The gatekeeper opens the gate for him, and the sheep hear his voice. He calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. When he has brought out all his own, he goes ahead of them, and the sheep follow him because they know his voice. They will not follow a stranger, but they will run from him because they do not know the voice of strangers." Jesus used this figure of speech with them, but they did not understand what he was saying to them. So again Jesus said to them, "Very truly, I tell you, I am the gate for the sheep. All who came before me are thieves and bandits; but the sheep did not listen to them. I am the gate. Whoever enters by me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture. The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly."

### FIRST LESSON: Acts 2:42-47

- I Today's lesson is a description of life in the community following St. Peter's sermon on The Day of Pentecost, when The Holy Spirit was poured out in new ways on Jesus' people. The new community is sustained in worship and fellowship, shares what they have, and ensures that everyone has enough.
- L <sup>42</sup>The baptized devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers. <sup>43</sup>Awe came upon everyone, because many wonders and signs were being done by the apostles. <sup>44</sup>All who believed were together and had all things in common; <sup>45</sup>they would sell their possessions and goods and distribute the proceeds to all, as any had need. <sup>46</sup>Day by day, as they spent much time together in the temple, they broke bread at home and ate their food with glad and generous hearts, <sup>47</sup>praising God and having the goodwill of all the people. And day by day the Lord added to their number those who were being saved.

### SECOND LESSON: 1 Peter 2:19-25

L Doing the right things does not guarantee that one will not experience difficulties, hardships, rejection, or even suffering. Here Jesus is presented as the model for our path of endurance and loyalty to God our Father, particularly amid adversity.

L <sup>19</sup>It is a credit to you if, being aware of God, you endure pain while suffering unjustly. <sup>20</sup>If you endure when you are beaten for doing wrong, what credit is that? But if you endure when you do right and suffer for it, you have God's approval. <sup>21</sup>For to this you have been called, because Christ also suffered for you, leaving you an example, so that you should follow in his steps. <sup>22</sup>"He committed no sin, and no deceit was found in his mouth." <sup>23</sup>When he was abused, he did not return abuse; when he suffered, he did not threaten; but he entrusted himself to the one who judges justly. <sup>24</sup>He himself bore our sins in his body on the cross, so that, free from sins, we might live for righteousness; by his wounds you have been healed. <sup>25</sup>For you were going astray like sheep, but now you have returned to the shepherd and guardian of your souls.





The food packages are Providing shelter and support for earthquake survivors whose homes were units in the 500-unit community. Each unit has running water and includes clothing and solar lights. An initial shipment arrived in Turkey on February 20. We are also coordinating with partners to distribute ready-to-eat food, destroyed or badly damaged: In Kirikhan, a district in Hatay Province exfabricated container housing community. The units are designed to shelter two rooms, a cooking area and a bathroom with a shower and toilet. Addimonthly food packages. The hygiene packages are expected to include liquid soap, shampoo, hand and bath soap, toothbrushes and toothpaste, toilet paper, wet wipes, feminine hygiene products, dishwashing detergent, launliving in the container community with emergency hygiene packages and crackers, tahini, and molasses. Supplying food, clothing and essential suphealth and hygiene kits, feminine hygiene kits and baby care packages intionally, we are working with our local partner to supply all 500 families expected to include sunflower oil, rice, bulgur, lentils, beans, chickpeas, plies. We airlifted urgently needed supplies including tents, tarps, winter barley noodles, pasta, tea. sugar, ready soup, tomato paste, salt, olives,

We are preparing to ship LWR Quilts, Baby Care Kits and Personal Care Kits. We will expand our response to reach more earthquake survivors as we secure additional funding. We expect to support primary health care delivery, psychosocial counseling and protection activities for earthquake survivors in short-term and temporary housing camps. We also expect to provide additional hygiene services, including supplying
