



**GOSPEL: St. John 13:31-35** 

L After Jesus washed His disciples' feet, predicted His betrayal, and then revealed His betrayer, Jesus teaches about His glorification on His cross and in His empty tomb. This deep complicated love of Jesus, even to death on His cross and resurrection from His tomb, are the distinctive marks of Jesus' holy catholic church.

<sup>31</sup>When he had gone out, Jesus said, "Now the Son of Man has been glorified, and God has been glorified in him. <sup>32</sup>If God has been glorified in him, God will also glorify him in himself and will glorify him at once. <sup>33</sup>Little children, I am with you only a little longer. You will look for me; and as I said to the Jews so now I say to you, 'Where I am going, you cannot come.' <sup>34</sup>I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. <sup>35</sup>By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

### FIRST LESSON: Acts 11:1-18

In defense of His earlier Holy Baptism of non-Jewish believers, St. Peter demonstrates to the members of Jesus' Jerusalem church that Jesus' intention to love and serve Gentiles as well as Jews is revealed in His teachings and testimony. In this way Jesus' ministries and missions to the Gentiles is officially authorized.

L Now the apostles and the believers who were in Judea heard that the Gentiles had also accepted the word of God. <sup>2</sup>So when Peter went up to Jerusalem, the circumcised believers criticized him, <sup>3</sup>saying, "Why did you go to uncircumcised men and eat with them?" <sup>4</sup>Then Peter began to explain it to them, step by step, saying, <sup>5</sup>I was in the city of Joppa praying, and in a trance I saw a vision. There was something like a large sheet coming down from heaven, being lowered by its four corners; and it came close to me. <sup>6</sup>As I looked at it closely I saw four-footed animals, beasts of prey, reptiles, and birds of the air. <sup>7</sup>I also heard a voice saying to me, 'Get up, Peter; kill and eat.' <sup>8</sup>But I replied, By no means, Lord; for nothing profane or unclean has ever entered my mouth.' But a second time the voice answered from heaven, 'What God has made clean, you must not call profane.' <sup>10</sup>This happened three times; then everything was pulled up again to heaven. <sup>11</sup>At that very moment three men, sent to me from Caesarea, arrived at the house where we were. 12 The Spirit told me to go with them and not to make a distinction between them and us. These six brothers also accompanied me, and we entered the man's house. <sup>13</sup>He told us how he had seen the angel standing in his house and saying, 'Send to Joppa and bring Simon, who is called Peter; <sup>14</sup>he will give you a message by which you and your entire household will be saved.' <sup>15</sup>And as I began to speak, the Holy Spirit fell upon them just as it had upon us at the beginning. <sup>16</sup>And I remembered the word of the Lord, how he had said, 'John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit.' 17If then God gave them the same gift that he gave us when we believed in the Lord Jesus Christ, who was I that I could hinder God?" <sup>18</sup>When they heard this, they were silenced. And they praised God, saying, "Then God has given even to the Gentiles the repentance that leads to life."


### SECOND LESSON: Revelation 21:1-6



# Dads on Duty at Lake Weir Middle School

A Message from Fred O'Brien, Team Leader for The Rock:

Your support of The Rock is helping many children at Lake Weir Middle School. As you may know, the situation at Lake Weir Middle School is difficult. Some learners live in the forest. Some come from broken homes. Some are facing family drug problems. There is a lack of positive role models.

Every year, 3 or 4 girls attempt suicide. 30% of the school is failing. 35% of the school has discipline issues.

We would like to see how much interest in this program exists We would also like to establish some volunteers, including parents of students if possible. We then plan to meet with the school staff to establish expectations and guidelines, and finally, we will do background checks, schedule volunteers, and start making a difference in the lives of these children.

### Some questions:

## How big would the time commitment be?

Whatever you could give. Just an hour or two a couple times a month would make a difference. Volunteers will be able to schedule themselves when they are available.

## What would "Dads" do?

Just having a few dads in the cafeteria having lunch would have a calming and positive effect. A few dads to greet learners in the morning as they arrive, be in the hallways during class changes and wish them well as they leave the building. Many students need adult role models.
