




FIRST LESSON: Acts 7:55-60

L St. Stephen was one of the seven men chosen by Jesus' apostles to serve tables so that the apostles could be free to proclaim Jesus' Gospel (Acts 6:1-6). St. Stephen does more than distribute food, however. For his preaching of Jesus' Gospel, he becomes the first martyr of the faith.

SECOND LESSON: 1 Peter 2:2-10

L Jesus is the cornerstone of God our Father's saving work and the foundation of our lives. We are God our Father's chosen people, made Holy in His Son Jesus' righteousness, who continuously celebrate and declare the forgiveness, grace, love, mercy, and salvation we experience through Jesus.

L ²Like newborn infants, long for the pure, spiritual milk, so that by it you may grow into salvation — ³if indeed you have tasted that the Lord is good. ⁴Come to him, a living stone, though rejected by mortals yet chosen and precious in God's sight, and ⁵like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. ⁶For it stands in scripture: "See, I am laying in Zion a stone, a cornerstone chosen and precious; and whoever believes in him will not be put to shame." ⁷To you then who believe, he is precious; but for those who do not believe, "The stone that the builders rejected has become the very head of the corner," ⁸and "A stone that makes them stumble, and a rock that makes them fall." They stumble because they disobey the word, as they were destined to do. ⁹But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, in order that you may proclaim the mighty acts of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light. ¹⁰Once you were not a people, but now you are God's people; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy.




