FRWA BYLAWS

How many of you have read the FRWA bylaws recently? Reminder of a few items.

Article 11-Objectives

--Support the objectives and policies of the FFRW, NFRW, The Republican National Committee (RNC), the Republican Party of Florida (RPOF), and to work for the election of the Republican Party' nominees.

Article III- Policies

Section 2. SPLIT TICKET. Neither the Club or an individual member shall advocate a split ticket, support an opposition party candidate or act against the NFRW or FFRW policies and bylaws.

Split-ticket voting. Split-ticket voting is a practice whereby individual voters spread their votes across multiple parties during an election.

Article IV – Membership

Section 4 Members shall be removed from the membership list for actively campaigning for non-Republican candidates or for working against the objectives of the FRWA, FFRW or NFRW.

Dues received after October 1 for new members shall pay for the balance of the calendar year (2020) and through the following fiscal year (2021)

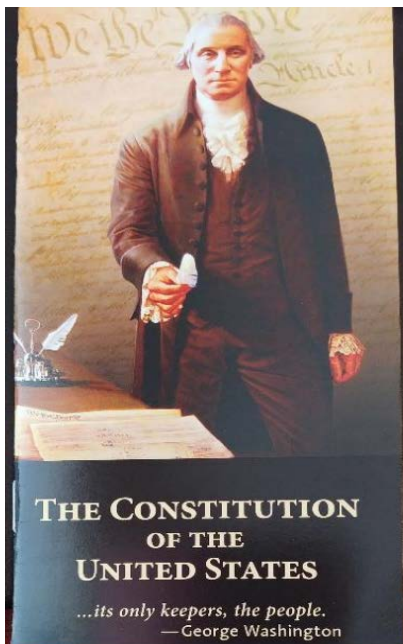
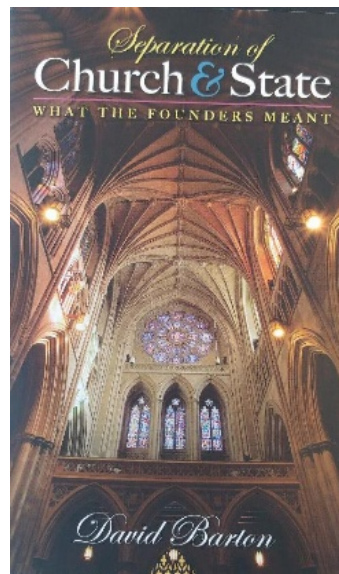
