### Hort. Committee Report by Laura Vertz

I am proud to report that the gardens we nurture are doing exceptionally well. Our committee receives constant praise from our fellow citizens as they experience our gardens. I wish to thank all the committee members for their hard work, especially through drought and excessive heat. I also wish to thank ALL members of the AGC who signed up for maintenance and for doing great work! It is this collective effort that leads to positive results.



As we look to the future of our gardens, we continue to move toward incorporating an appropriate number of native plants, while maintaining ornamental appeal and compelling design. I recently read an article that argues this type of balanced approach is probably the best. (The title is "Native Versus Non-Native: Which Plants Are Best for Biodiversity" by Lincoln Garland, May 2020.) Garland is a proponent of native plants, but raises some important points about non-native plants.

One of the biggest issues with non-native plants is that they may become invasive. He suggests that while this is certainly true and is a real problem, only a few non-native plants are invasive. (Please see our resident expert Jane Buck on this topic!)

With climate change, there is an ongoing question about how well native plants may thrive. Their geographical location is authentic, but some natives may not do as well with a warming climate.

As pollinators, some non-native plants also perform well.

In short, Garland argues that it is important that gardeners do not become too polarized on the issue of native versus non-native plants, that we continue to add native plants to our ornamental gardens as we deem appropriate, and that we continue to learn about how our gardens are evolving in reaction to climate change.
