Meeting was paused for program *Tabletops & Tablescapes by Kathi Rose*. Holly thanked Kathi for this wonderful program, which included raffle prizes for some lucky winners.

Secretary's Report: Chris Priller thanked Betty Sprovieri & Nancy Colby for taking minutes in her absence. October 13 Regular Meeting Minutes were published in the November *Garden Dirt*. NOTE: *October 22 board meeting minutes were approved by Holly & distributed to all board members. Norma Lucansky pointed out several corrections. Horticulture Committee Report

The committee met on Nov. 5 at the Antioch Library. Members of the committee are George Weckbacher, Holly Svehla, Sharon Pendergast, Jennifer Wittenberg, Donna Rieter, Judy Caldwell, and June Miller. (All AGC members are welcome to join!)

The committee discussed and reviewed the many garden's needs.

One issue that came up was the replacement of the Mini Park tree that was previously lost at the West entrance. The SW corner needs an anchor tree again. After discussion of trees available to go in that space, it was decided that a White Birch should be planted there. (Follow up note: June Buck offered funds from the Arbor Day Committee to purchase the tree.)

Committee discussed the health of the viburnum tree at the front the NE corner by the art gallery. It seems to be dying. It was agreed we would allow it to winter over and see what the health of the tree is in the spring before taking any actions.

Also discussed was the "abundance" of plants that need to be culled out. It was decided that during spring cleanup (March 28, 2026), excess plants will be separated and set aside in pots for the spring plant sale on May 16, 2026. Hosta, irises, and Solomon's seal were suggested to be donated to the plant sale.

General discussion followed on the planting of the annuals during the spring planting event. We will need volunteer(s) to do the large pots. What to plant for annuals was discussed, and it was decided that all members should bring their suggestions to the next meeting in January. The chair was tasked to contact local vendors to see what they plan to have available next spring.

Discussion was held about the "color of the garden" thought the year. We discussed the different times that bulbs show color. (See bloom-time chart next page.) The committee decided we should put some early bulbs such as crocus to be planted on the edge of the Main Street sidewalk for early color. (Follow up note: It was found that there are no crocus bulbs available locally – all vendors are sold out.)

The committee also discussed decorating the large planters for the winter. (Follow up note: Asked for volunteers at the November Club meeting, but no one offered to decorate the planters.)

Native plants (more and different types) were discussed for us to plant in the future, - No consensus made on this issue other than "yes," we need to keep this in mind.

Other issues were discussed such as providing something to attract birds to the gardens. Hummingbirds were suggested as they would enhance the public's enjoyment as well as they are pollinators. It was agreed to include birds (not just pollinators) in our garden decisions in the future.



There was no consensus on how or what we can do on this issue.


