Sheriff's Detective Receives Rural Domestic Violence

Award

At the 22nd Annual Rural Domestic Violence Statewide Training seminar hosted by Florida Coalition Against Domestic Violence (FCADV) and Saint Leo University, Detective Rachel Montgomery was awarded with the 2019 Mellie McDaniel award.

This award is presented to outstanding law enforcement professionals responding to domestic violence in rural communities.

FCADV honors the memory of Mellie McDaniel, a Victim Advocate in Jackson County, FL who was killed, along with Jackson County Deputy Michael Altman, in a 2007 incident by two men with criminal histories.

Detective Montgomery was nominated by Citrus County Abuse Shelter (CASA) Director, Mrs. Sunshine Arnold. Director Arnold commented in her nomination "Rachel goes above and beyond the call of duty to ensure survivors of domestic violence and their children receive the services and resources they need."

A Survivor's Success Story

CASA's Economic Empowerment Program is a vital part of the services offered to survivors of domestic violence through our

Outreach Center, and we love to share when we have a great success story. Recently, through this program, CASA was able to assist a young mother of five escape domestic violence. The young mother came to us with only a few clothes for her and her children. She had no car, no cash and was unemployed with no place to go. After attending and graduating from our Economic Empowerment Classes, "Moving Ahead Through Financial Management," she was able to be proactive in recreating a life for her and her children. This mother was able to secure employment, file income taxes and purchase a vehicle. She received the keys to her new, four-bedroom home last month. With CASA funding, she is now enrolled in a certification class for phlebotomy in order to provide sustainability for their financial future. Through hard work and perseverance, this young mother was able to use all the resources available to her to ensure that she and her children were safe and happy.

We are very proud of her success and are thrilled that we were able to witness it. Her success is CASA's reward for the dedication, training and our constant search for community partners and resources. Together, we are making a difference. That "difference" is saving lives!
