Meet Pam. Pam, is one our volunteers here at CASA that we count on everyday to help keep things running smoothly. From answering the phones to greeting people coming into the outreach office to accepting and organizing donations in our donation room. Pam was talking with a friend one day when the friend brought up an interesting video about a teenager who had been abducted by an older

gentleman and was rescued because of a video that she had seen on TikTok. The video described a specific hand signal that was created to help victims of domestic violence relay the message "I need help" without having to say anything in case their abuser was in close proximity. The teenager was in the man's vehicle and was displaying the signal to passing motorists. Finally, one motorist recognized it and called 911. The teen was rescued and the man was arrested.

Pam brought this information to the attention of her managers at CASA and now this hand gesture is taught to all of our employees to relay to participants that stay in our shelter and attend our various classes so that they can use it in case they are ever in a situation where they need to let someone know they need help and cannot verbalize it. Thanks to Pam, we have raised awareness of this gesture to help domestic violence victims and perhaps save someone's life. Below is Pam demonstrating the steps to perform the live saving hand gesture.
