Missions Partner Update / December 2019



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Joy-filled greetings from Schultz's! Glorianne and I pray that this Advent/Christmas season finds you encouraged in the Lord! We are doing well and grateful to be celebrating our 40th year of missionary service here in the Washington D.C. area. We are also thankful for the Christian friends who have made these years of ministry possible and wanted to update you on our activities as we prepare for this New Year.

LIGHT AND LIFE TO ALL HE BRINGS

I don't know about you. Still, one of my very favorite Christmas hymns is "Hark the Herald Angels Sing," which contains a verse that describes our ministry experience over this past year; *Hail! The heaven-born Prince of peace! Hail! The Son of Righteousness! Light and life to all he brings, "Risen with healing in his wings."*

This year we had the privilege of ministering to people from many nations and walks of life at worship services, retreats, conferences, Bible studies, inner-city missions, and other outreaches. Some were struggling with a broken marriage and family relationships, drug, alcohol, and pornography addictions. Others with homelessness, grieving due to the death of loved ones from illness, drug overdoses, suicide, and other life situations that left them hopeless. As we preached the Gospel and applied God's Word to their life situations, we saw the light, life, and healing of Christ restore hope to many broken lives!

WE MISSIONS NETWORK

One of the highlights of our year was expanding our *WE (Worship Equippers) Missions Network* to help equip believers who minister in the *10/40 Missions Window*, a geographic region framing northern Africa, the Middle East, and Asia, which contains the least evangelized people groups in the world.



One of our new partners is Bishop Abraham Nhial, one of the "Lost Boys of South Sudan," who walked over one thousand miles to freedom after witnessing the murder of his parents and other family members during the Sudanese war where millions died. His story was featured on 60 Minutes and the movie entitled *The Good Lie*, starring Reese Witherspoon. Today Bishop Abraham, who God miraculously brought to the United States to attend seminary during the Sudanese diaspora, has returned home to South Sudan, where he serves as the Anglican Bishop of Aweil, a region of nearly 3 million residents.



We also formed a partnership with the *Good Shepherd Anglican Church of India (GSACI)*, who invited our ministry to develop an equipping curriculum for their pastors who serve approximately 4500 churches located throughout India, a nation that ranks among the top ten for the

persecution of Christians. We are especially excited about this opportunity since the *GSACI* is focused on reaching the Dalit people group (a.k.a. the Untouchables) who missiologists consider being among the most persecuted people groups in the world.

The term Dalit has its roots in Sanskrit, an ancient Indo-European language of India, which means "broken, cracked, trodden down, scattered, crushed or destroyed." The dominant Hindu castes of India believe that the Dalit's are animals – "outcastes" who live *outside* the caste system. Because of this apartheid-like attitude, the Dalits serve as manual scavengers who clean city sewers, remove human waste from homes, pick up the dead carcasses of animals from roadways, and other degrading tasks that have left generations of Dalits without hope.

Dalits are regular victims of caste motivated murders, rapes, beatings, and serve as the world's largest supplier of sex slaves. They are discriminated against in the areas of health care (many have contracted polio and leprosy), housing, property ownership, freedom of religion, free choice of employment, and equal treatment before the law. They are forbidden to enter a temple or public park. They cannot draw water from an open water source unless given permission. They must sit separately from other castes in public gatherings. Their children are required to sit in the back of the class in government schools, which they typically leave by age 11. As a result, most Dalit's are illiterate. Upon hearing the Good News, Dalits identify with our Lord Jesus Christ, who was "despised and rejected by men, acquainted with grief and sorrows" (Is 53:3) and "suffered outside the city gate" (Heb 13:13). Though persecuted and often beaten for their faith, the Dalits make up a majority of India's Christian community, which is estimated to be 2.3 percent of the country's 1.3 billion population.



I witnessed this persecution first hand while in India this year when I was honored to meet this dear pastor who had been attacked with an ax by Hindu militants who chopped off a portion of his buttocks and upper thigh. For the past two years, he has gone through numerous surgeries and physical therapy to walk, which requires a crutch that you see him holding. Though he endured great pain and suffering, this soldier of the cross and his family have continued to move forward in their ministry as have these pastors I was with at a conference who had all been beaten severely for their faith.

Other highlights of our year included gathering with over 13,000 pastors and worship leaders at the *Sing 2019 Worship Conference* in Nashville, TN, hosted by Getty Music and introducing our worship resources at the *New Wineskins Missions Conference* held near Asheville, NC, which was attended by over 1500 missionaries, church planters, and Christian educators from around the world.
