Entering one horse/rider combination for both days?

- 2. Another Entry Form for Sunday (show #2)
- 3. USEF Federation Entry Agreement (page 19) with ALL signatures.
- 4. USEF Waiver and Release of Liability (page 20) SIGNED.
- 5. Proofs of memberships & horse recording(s). See "How to use eqverification.org" on page 4 for the easy way to do this.
- 6. Optional: copy of your horse's breed registration; we might have a high point award for his breed!

What is a Qualifying Ride?

This confuses everyone!

Scores earned at these ODS-approved USEF/USDF-licensed shows can be used to qualify for two different championships — the ODS Championship Show and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Region Championship Show.

When we talk about "capital Q" Qualifying rides, Qualifying fees, and memberships required for Qualifying classes, we're talking about the USDF Regional Championship Show, sponsored by the Great American Insurance Group (GAIG).

If your goal is to ride in the ODS Championship Show, it's up to you to keep track of your "little q" qualifying scores, which can be earned at any tests of the level. You don't have to declare anything at the qualifying show nor pay any extra fees; just be an ODS member at the time you earn the scores. If your goal is to Qualify for a GAIG/USDF Regional Championship Show, carefully read page 17 of this prize list. To learn more, visit the USDF website, <u>www.usdf.org</u>

OWNERSHIP NOTE: to qualify for/compete in GAIG/USDF Championships, Owner must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership and a USEF membership (Junior Active, Senior Active, Life, or Recorded Farm with Active Farm membership). If the horse has more than one owner, at least one of them (*the same person or entity!*) must have both active USEF membership and active USDF Participating or Business Membership **and must be the owner of record with USEF and USDF.** For a business or farm to be the valid owner under this requirement, it must be listed as an owner of the horse with both USEF and USDF.

ABOUT THE CASCADE DRESSAGE SHOWS AT TULELAKE...

AWARDS...Awards to 1st, rosettes through 6th. Breed awards will be solicited based on entries. Let us know *early* — and be sure to include copy of horse's breed registration *with entry* — if you'd like us to request an award for your breed.

High percentage awards each show: Open, Adult Amateur, Junior,/Young Rider and Vintage riders; CCODS member.

DIRECTIONS...South end of Main Street in Tulelake, off Hwy 139. Look for fairground signs.

ENTRIES...*This show can be entered online at <u>www.EqEntries.com</u>; see page 4.*

Each day is a separate show and requires a separate entry. All entries will be processed in postmark order. In the event of oversubscription, priority for classes and stabling will be given to those showing both days. When stabling is full, subsequent entries will be placed on a waiting list unless they can participate without stabling. *Please see additional entry rules on pages 5–9.* **Cross-entry between Opportunity classes and any other class** *is* **permitted**, subject to DR119. Please see **Opportunity Classes**, page 6, for more information.

Classes will be split by rider age/status (Open, Adult Amateur, Jr/YR) if entries warrant. Class split policy will be posted.

FACILITY

\$100 TURF REPAIR FEE will be assessed for damage caused by your negligence (i.e., allowing horse to paw/dig when tied at trailer, or lunging on wet ground). PLEASE BE CONSIDERATE OF OUR BEAUTIFUL FACILITY.

Arenas & Footing...Two competition and one warmup arena, ALL TURF. All tests ridden in 20m x 60m court. *No warmup or schooling in competition arenas.* No one allowed on foot in warmup arena. Lungeing location will be posted.

Camping on grounds...Permit required for every tent/RV/occupied trailer. \$30/night with electricity or if parked at a hookup, hooked up or not. \$20/night without electricity. Hookups are limited; first come, first served. Showers and restrooms on grounds.

EARLY ARRIVALS: please be aware that competition arenas will be closed.

Children...Children must be under adult supervision AT ALL TIMES.

Food...At this time, no food vendor or delivery on site. Updates will be emailed to competitors.

Pets...Dogs must be on a leash and under control at all times. Other animals/livestock not allowed without prior approval of show management.

STABLING...Friday noon-Sunday evening; first bedding (baled shavings) included. Arena and West side, \$110/weekend. Panel pens, \$120/weekend. Early arrival/late departure requires permission of Show Management. Stalls may not be resold or sublet by exhibitors. Stabling is limited and will be filled on a first-come basis, with priority given to horses entered both days. Specify one of the following on your entry, or we will assume that you have no preference:

Arena side - 10'x12' permanent box stalls with solid top & bottom doors. \$110/FRI-SUN

West side - 10'x10' permanent stalls with 5' plywood-sheathed corral panel fronts. No top doors. \$110/[?] FRI-SUN.

Panel pens - 16'x16' temporary corral panel pens are under roof but not separated from neighbors. \$120/? FRI-SUN

SCHEDULING & RIDE TIMES...We guarantee that if you ride the same level both days, you'll ride for both judges.

Classes will *not* be scheduled in numeric order. Tentative times will be posted at <u>www.ccods.org</u> the weekend prior to the show; final times will be posted at the show office. Every effort will be made to notify exhibitors of significant changes to their times; however, responsibility for obtaining final ride times from show management remains with the competitor.

You're gonna love EgEntries!

Whether you call it EgEntries or Equestrian Entries, go to www.EgEntries.com or www.EguestrianEntries.com, it's all the same.

Advantages of using www.EgEntries.com:

- Minimize your data entry time, whether you choose to pay with credit card or check. Create one account for all your horse(s), rider(s), owner(s), trainer(s) & coach(s) information and you won't have to type any of it again to enter any of the hundreds of shows available through EgEntries!
- USDF and USEF memberships and registrations for people and horses listed on your account are automatically verified and proofs downloaded to the show secretary with your entry.
- Scan additional cards and documents, upload them to your account and they'll be ready for you to attach to any online entry.
- Entries submitted online are time/date stamped: no worries about getting to the post office before it closes or illegible postmarks.

Here's how it works:

- 1. START EARLY. Gather all the usual information you need when filling out entry forms: membership numbers, recording numbers and correct spellings of names for you, your horse, and anyone who might ride or train your horse or coach your rider at a show.
- 2. You'll also need everyone's correct address, email, and phone; minor rider birthdates; horse's height, age, color, and gender; horse's name, exactly as recorded with USEF/USDF. (And those recording numbers)
- 3. Make sure everyone's USEF and USDF memberships are current. Bear with me you only have to do this once! USEF and USDF memberships/horse recordings will automatically be verified and proofs sent to the show secretary.
- 4. You may need to scan one or two additional documents the same ones you would copy and send with a mailed entry: • Horse's breed registration certificate, if you wish to be eligible for breed awards at the show. • Proof of eligibility if entering a freestyle
- 5. Any time before entries open, go to www.EgEntries.com. Click the **JOIN NOW** tab at the top of the screen and follow the instructions to create your account and to download/sign/upload the two current USEF signature documents and any additional documents vou've scanned.
- 6. On opening day, return to www.EgEntries.com. LOG IN and click on the CALENDAR button. Scroll to the show you want to enter, then click its **SIGN UP** button in the rightmost column.
- 7. Follow the online instructions to complete your entry. NOTE that EgEntries, like all Dressage show, allows only one rider per horse. If your horse will have two riders in one show, you'll need to complete separate entries. Don't worry; after the first entry you can skip the USEF drug fee, office fee and stabling fees.
- 8. Upon completion of your entry, choose either SUBMIT AND PAY to enter your credit/debit card information and confirm the entry or click **PRINT** so that you can mail the completed entry to the Show Secretary with a check.
- 9. If you choose to pay online, EqEntries will assess a 5% service charge; if you print and mail with your check, there is no fee.
- 10. Remember that each day of this weekend is a separate show. Repeat Steps 7 & 8 to enter the second show.

That's it! EgEntries will acknowledge submission of your entry and forward it to me. Once I've processed it, I'll send you an email, too.

How to Use www.eqverification.org

If you choose not to use Egentries, this USEF-run site will let you print verification of memberships/recordings all on one sheet! NOTE: as of early March, this tool does NOT work correctly with the Firefox browser.

- 1. Go to <u>www.eqverification.org</u> and click the USDF logo to get started.
- 2. HORSE: do not enter a horse name unless you are positive that it is exactly as the horse is recorded. USDF will match on a partial name; USEF will only match if that partial is the first part of the name.
- 3. After you match the owner, you'll be prompted to find the rider. If same as owner, just enter the name again.
- 4. If matches aren't found...
 - Maybe you didn't type the name correctly? Try again.
 - Maybe the membership renewal hasn't vet been processed? Check the USEF or USDF website to see if it's posted there.
 - Maybe the names aren't the same with both organizations? This is a HUGE problem and you need to fix it. Pick the version you want to keep, then contact the other organization (USEF or USDF) directly and ask for help updating the name to match.

Vaccination Policy...see USEF GR844 for full text

Download the form from <u>https://www.usef.org/compete/resources-forms/rules-regulations/drugs-medications</u> and **bring the appropriate completed and signed document(s)** with you to the competition.

Do NOT send proof of vaccination with your entry; keep it with the horse!

Competition Management reserves the right to review vaccination documentation upon arrival. Non-compliant entries may be quarantined or denied permission to unload and will not be allowed to compete nor to mingle with other horses.

No refunds will be given if right to compete is denied because the Vaccination Record is missing or incomplete. Whether the horse is vaccinated by a veterinarian or by an owner or agent, or is exempt for medical or age reasons, documentation is required; see GR844 for details.

USEF Motorized Vehicle Statement...GR1301.7 & 1301.8

- 7. Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.
- 8. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to Segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

Safe Sport

Safe Sport compliance is MANDATORY at all USEF-licensed competitions!

Reminder: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. USEF Membership Statement

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR231) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

ATTENTION, COMPETITORS

Each competitor is responsible for supplying management with correct association numbers (USEF, USDF/ODS, CDS) for horse, owner, rider, trainer and coach before the start of the competition. The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted toward national or state year-end awards.

Opportunity Classes

Opportunity classes are intended by USEF to allow entry-level *participants* (riders, horses, owners) to 'test the waters' of recognized competition. There are no USEF or USDF membership or horse recording requirements, nor Show Pass/non-member fees, for Opportunity classes.

- Horses entered only in Opportunity classes are also exempt from the USEF Equine Drugs and Medication fee but are still subject to and must comply with the USEF Drugs and Medication rules and are subject to drug testing.
- Horses entered only in Opportunity classes are not required to have a Horse Identification (HID) or Recording Number but must list the USEF or USDF HID or Recording number(s) if the horse has been assigned one.
- Riders, owners, trainers, and coaches participating only in Opportunity classes are exempt from USEF membership requirements and non-member fees but must list the Federation membership number if the participant is a member.
- Opportunity class riders may compete wearing breeches and shirts of any color as permitted in DR120. Jackets or vests of any type are allowed but not required and neckwear may be worn only if the rider chooses to compete in a riding jacket. Boots and protective headgear are required as specified in DR120.1.6. (Think 'clinic attire'.)

Please note that:

- Entry in Opportunity classes is not limited to non-members.
- Membership fees are only waived for the Opportunity classes. Cross-entry in non-Opportunity classes is permitted at these
 competitions, but people and horses cross-entered in non-Opportunity classes are subject to the usual horse recording and
 membership requirements.
- Results for Opportunity classes are reported, but do not count toward any awards, nor qualify for any championships not even if membership requirements are met.

GENERAL INFORMATION ABOUT ENTERING A USEF-LICENSED, USDF-RECOGNIZED, ODS-APPROVED SHOW

EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT FEDERATION RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.

All exhibitors, by completing their entry, acknowledge and attest that they have read and understand all terms of these rules, wherever listed in this prize list.

General Rules and Regulations

• All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the show management whose decision shall be final.

- Every horse entered for competition will comply with the rules of the horse show management, but management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold this horse show and the officials and employees of the show blameless for any loss or accident to his horse, employees, equipment, which may occur from sickness, fire or otherwise.
- The management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit entries and cancel award prizes without claims for damages; to cancel or combine unfilled classes, or to reschedule classes after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings or rotate judges.
- Exhibitors are notified that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the judges or officials, on the part of the owner, manager, rider, or groom shall disqualify the horse, and the owner shall forfeit his entry fee and other fees.
- Show management reserves to itself the power to prohibit any person from attending or showing a horse in the ring and to remove any groom or horse from the show without being liable for compensation.
- Bio-hazardous medical waste containers will be provided in the stable area. All exhibitors and their agents are responsible for the
 proper disposal of this waste. Competition management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their
 agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments.
- No person will be allowed in the show ring during the time of judging except the exhibitor and those having official or requested duties to perform.
- From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on any competition or schooling entry must wear **protective headgear**, defined as a riding helmet which meets or exceeds ASTM/SEI standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. The harness must be secured and the helmet properly fitted.
- Management may announce prior to or during the competition that competitors can show without jackets due to extreme heat. If jackets are waived, competitors must wear a shirt with sleeves and collar, without neckwear, and without bold pattern. Eliminations are now mandatory for all dress code violations specified in USEF rules.

General Rules for Riders

- Competitors are allowed in/around the competition arena only during their scheduled ride times and during posted schooling hours.
- If a mathematical error on the scoresheet is discovered, it must be brought to the attention of competition management within one hour of the official posting of the scores from the last class of that competition day.
- Classes may be scheduled out of order, it is the competitor's responsibility to find out their ride times, and to immediately notify show management of any time conflicts that may have escaped the scheduler's notice.
- Failure to enter the competition arena at the assigned time will result in elimination.

Class Splits and Rider Divisions

Classes at these recognized shows may be split by division — Open, Junior, Young Rider, Adult Amateur, or any combination — at the discretion of show management. Be sure to indicate rider's division on entry, or you will be put into the Open section by default. Eligibility for the various divisions is specified in the U.S. Equestrian Rule Book, which is available online at www.usef.org. See rule DR119.3 for Juniors and Young Riders; GR1306 and 1307 for Amateur.

- Riders are Juniors (JR) until the end of the calendar year in which they turn 18. They must provide their birthdate on the entry form as proof of age.
- Riders are Young Riders (YR) from the beginning of the calendar year in which they turn 16 until the end of the calendar year in which they turn 21. They also must provide their birthdate on the entry form as proof of age.
- Adults are Amateurs (Am or AA) only if the USEF has certified them as such. Please be aware that, per the adult amateur definition in the Dressage rules, riders cannot compete as an Adult Amateurs until they are no longer eligible to compete as Young Riders. USEF members who apply for amateur certification will find the word AMATEUR printed on their membership cards. A photocopy of this card or status verification from eqverification.org or eqentries.org is required as proof of eligibility for Amateur classes.
- Riders who don't fit any of the above categories must compete in the Open division.

Entry Rules for Horses

- A horse must be 36 months of age (from foaling date) to compete under saddle in the Dressage division. The minimum age requirement increases with the difficulty of the level; see DR119.1 for details.
- A horse may be entered in a class only once, even if it has two different riders.
- It may compete in a maximum of three tests per day at Fourth Level and below, or two tests above Fourth Level. Musical rides are included in these counts; equitation and materiale classes are not.
- A horse may be entered in no more than two consecutive levels at any one competition. (Exception: Pas de Deux.)
- Note that Intermediate 1 (including the Int-1 Freestyle) and Intermediate 2 are *not* consecutive levels; a horse may not be entered in both at the same competition.

The Entry Form

 A completed entry is required for every horse brought onto the show grounds. Horses not entered in the show may not be brought onto the show grounds without prior permission of show management.

- In the Dressage division, each horse/rider combination is considered a separate entry and is issued a separate number. Therefore, a completed entry form is required for each horse/rider combination for each show.
- An entry is not complete without full payment, proper signatures, and proof of all required memberships and horse enrollments. Competitions have the right to refuse entries that are in any way incomplete.
- Fill out the entry form found in the back of this prize list unless you are entering via EqEntries.com_ In either case, complete the *Federation Entry Agreement* and the USEF Waiver (last two pages of this prize list) with all signatures. Scan and upload both pages to EqEntries.com for submission with your entry if you want to pay by credit card or print and mail to the show secretary with the entry form(s), proofs of membership, and payment, if you're paying by check.
- Separate signatures are required for Rider, Owner and Trainer. If it's all the same person, three signatures are still required.
- Ties regarding entries received at any time on the same day will be broken by lot; said drawing will be held at 4PM on the first Sunday following the published close of entries at the office of the competition secretary. Any potential entrant has the right to be present in person or by representative at the drawing of lots.
- Phoned or faxed entries will not be accepted. Emailed entries will not be considered complete until check for full payment is received.
- Credit card payments can only be accepted through **EqEntries.com**. Snail mailed entries must be accompanied by check for full payment. Once on the competition grounds, only cash or checks will be accepted.

Documentation that must be included with your entry

- Read 'How to Use Eqverification.org' on page 4. You will love this tool!
- It is perfectly legal to apply for any of these memberships/horse recordings at the show. However, it is far better to do it:
 1) well in advance of the show and
 - 2) online, so that you can print out proof of application or temporary membership cards.
- Always send photocopies of the following documents with your entry, or as soon thereafter as possible; it will help you avoid long lines when you check in at the show.
- WARNING: Membership in ODS (or CDS) does include a Group Membership in USDF, but there is always a delay until that USDF membership is processed and takes effect. If your Group Membership has not yet been processed, or you (or the horse's owner) wait to join ODS or CDS at a show, you will also need to complete the USDF affidavit form and submit the \$5 affidavit filing fee; scores may be applied to applicable USDF awards if the correct memberships have been applied for.
- If you plan to enter via **EqEntries.com**, make sure your memberships/horse recordings are current. Again, there may be a processing delay that will cause EqEntries to assess hefty non-member fees. Yes, they can be refunded, but it takes time.

Documentation for the Rider

NOTE that **EqEntries.com** will verify all memberships and horse recordings. You do NOT need to upload cards when entering online. **USEF:** Copy of current individual Junior, Senior or Life Competing membership card. Card must also say AMATEUR to be eligible for Adult Amateur division. USEF non-members and riders who cannot prove membership pay \$45 Show Pass fee. GREAT AMERICAN INSURANCE GROUP/USDF REGIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP QUALIFYING required proof that rider is a USEF Junior, Senior, or Life member.

EXEMPT FROM USEF MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENT AND NON-MEMBER FEES: riders competing only in USDF Pas de Deux and Quadrille tests and USEF Opportunity classes; citizens of other countries who are members in good standing of their own national federation. **USDF:** Copy of current membership card or Non-Member ID.

For each USDF Non-Member (NM) owner/lessee and USDF NM rider, there will be a USDF NM fee of \$35 per competition. In addition, a \$5 affidavit fee must be collected if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card.

EXEMPT FROM USDF MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENT AND NON-MEMBER FEES: Owners/lessees and riders competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF non-member ID requirements and fees. At these competitions, exempt classes include USDF IPas de Deux and Quadrille classes and USEF Opportunity classes.

Note: when you join ODS or CDS, you automatically will be enrolled as a Group member of USDF. ODS members will use their USDF number for both organizations; CDS members receive a different membership number;

GREAT AMERICAN INSURANCE GROUP/USDF REGIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP QUALIFYING requires proof that the rider is a USDF Participating member. A Group membership is not sufficient.

ODS does not charge a non-member fee, but non-member riders' scores will not count toward ODS championship qualifications.

Documentation for the Owner

NOTE that **EqEntries.com** will verify all memberships and horse recordings. You do NOT need to upload cards when entering online. **USEF**: copy of current individual Junior, Senior, or Life Competing membership card. If the horse is owned by a Farm or Business, membership must be in the name of the Farm/Business.

USEF non-members and owners who cannot prove membership pay \$45.00 Show Pass fee per show.

GREAT AMERICAN INSURANCE GROUP/USDF REGIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP QUALIFYING required proof that owner is a USEF Junior/Senior/Life or Farm/Business member.

USDF: copy of current membership card or Non-Member ID.

For each USDF Non-Member (NM) owner/lessee and USDF NM rider, there will be a USDF NM fee of \$35 per competition. In addition, a \$5 affidavit fee must be collected if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card.

EXEMPT FROM USDF MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENT AND NON-MEMBER FEES: Owners/lessees and riders competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF non-member ID requirements and fees. At these competitions, exempt classes include USDF Pas de Deux and Quadrille classes and USEF Opportunity classes.

Note: when you join ODS or CDS, you automatically will be enrolled as a Group member of USDF. ODS members will use their USDF number for both organizations; CDS members receive a different membership number;

GREAT AMERICAN INSURANCE GROUP/USDF REGIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP QUALIFYING requires proof that the owner/lessee is a USDF Participating member. A Group membership is not sufficient.

ODS: There is no membership requirement for owners of dressage horses.

Documentation for the Horse

USEF: A USEF Horse ID is not required for Dressage competition, but if your horse has a USEF Horse ID or annual or lifetime registration, you must provide that number.

GREAT AMERICAN INSURANCE GROUP/USDF REGIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP QUALIFYING requires proof that the horse has current annual or lifetime recording with USEF (Horse ID number not sufficient).

USDF: All horses competing in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized show must have at least a USDF Horse ID number.

EXEMPT FROM USDF HORSE ID REQUIREMENT: horses competing here only in USDF Pas de Deux and Quadrille classes or USEF Opportunity classes.

GREAT AMERICAN INSURANCE GROUP/USDF REGIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP QUALIFYING requires proof that the horse is USDF lifetime registered (Horse ID number not sufficient).

ODS: There is no horse registration program. However, several shows offer breed awards. It's always a good idea to include a copy of your horse's breed registration papers with your entry.

Documentation for the Trainer

TRAINER means "the adult who is responsible for the horse while it is on the show grounds." In the case of a minor, the parent or another adult must assume the responsibilities of "trainer." Therefore, every horse does indeed have a trainer, and that person must sign the entry and provide a copy of current **USEF** individual Senior or Life Competing membership card. USEF non-members and trainers who cannot prove membership pay \$45 Show Pass fee.

EXEMPT FROM THIS REQUIREMENT: parent signing as responsible party for a minor child's horse.

USDF/ODS: no membership requirement for Trainer.

Documentation for the Coach

A coach is a person who receives remuneration for "instructing, teaching, schooling or advising" the rider. If that person won't be coaching you on the show grounds, don't list them on the entry. Coaches must sign the entries of all riders they will be coaching at the show, and provide a copy of current **USEF** individual Senior or Life Competing membership card. USEF non-members and coaches who cannot prove membership pay \$45.00 Show Pass fee.

USDF/ODS: no membership requirement for Coach

USDF Statement on Animal Welfare

The United States Dressage Federation, Inc. (USDF), a federation of individual members and over 100 independent organizations throughout the United States, supports the concept of ethical treatment of animals.

Dressage is a classical method of training horses, based upon the horse's natural responses, as carried out in a gradual, planned program during which the horse's athletic abilities are improved in a systematic manner. As a result, the horse becomes capable, comfortable, and responsive in partnership with the rider without the use of force. Dressage competition at various levels of achievement is the ultimate test of the training program to determine whether the desired harmony between horse and rider has been achieved.


The rules pertaining to dressage competition prohibit the use of artificial appliances, training aids, and drugs, which would force the horse to submit. Instead, the emphasis is upon training and a cooperative partnership with the rider. Major competitions are carefully monitored to assure that there is no unnecessary force or harshness displayed.

Unlike other horse sports in which horses enter training at a relatively immature state, dressage training is usually not seriously begun until the horse is three or four. The top levels of achievement require five or more years of progressive training and it is not unusual to see horses in international competition in their late teens. This, in itself, places a premium on good care and soundness throughout the horse's life.

While supporting the concept of animal welfare in its broadest form, the United States Dressage Federation, Inc., also recognizes that it is unrealistic to ascribe human emotions and responses to the horse which in its wild state is a creature of flight, living a hard and precarious existence. Under domestication, the horse is assured of ample food, water, and shelter, as well as protection against infectious diseases and damaging parasites, thus leading a longer and healthier life with a high rate of survival.

As an educational organization, USDF has numerous programs, which teach people how to pursue the accepted, humane training methods. A program of certifying instructors also emphasizes protecting the horse's welfare in pursuit of dressage training.

ODS has offered an annual Championship Show since 1981. This show is traditionally the largest annual fundraiser for our organization and is a showcase of the best ODS horses and riders. You may qualify! Please join us for this wonderful event.

QUALIFYING RULES

General

- Rider must be a current ODS member in good standing at time scores are earned.
- Each horse entered must be ridden by the same rider throughout the competition
- Additionally, at no time during the Championship competition may an entered horse be ridden by anyone other than the rider entered on that horse (with the exception of a groom walking on a loose rein).
- Attach photocopies of the front cover of the gualifying tests to the entry form

Qualifying

- The qualifying season is September 1st of the previous year to August 25th of the current year
- Qualifying scores must be earned by a *horse/rider combination*, they cannot be earned separately.
- Only scores received at USEF/USDF Licensed shows may be used.
- Only scores received using current USDF / USEF / FEI approved dressage tests count.
- Championship scores will be calculated by averaging the percentages earned in the two tests ridden.
- Scores from the following dressage tests do not count for the ODS Championship Show

Dressage equitation	USDF Introductory Level	Scores earned at ODS approved League
Dressage suitability	Opportunity classes	shows and practice shows
Rider tests	Lead line classes	

Championship Classes

- Classes will be run under USEF/USDF Championship Rules
- Championship classes must be ridden from memory
- Whips are not allowed
- We will not be closing competition arena gates during tests, nor raking centerlines between riders.

Tests

- Tests selected for championship classes are at the discretion of show management.
- Training–Fourth Levels will ride the two highest tests of the level.
- FEI Championship classes will be judged by two judges.
- Horse/rider combinations may enter two levels, but may only ride in one division (Open, Adult Amateur, or Junior/Young Rider).
- Horse/rider combinations winning Championship Show classes may not compete at that level in future championship classes (except FEI).

Minimum Qualifying Scores:

- Entries must have earned two qualifying scores; per level, per division and from two different judges at two separate competitions.
- Qualifying scores may be earned at any test from the level.
- The minimum percentages are as follows:

CDS Pony Award

CDS has created a Pony Award. The high scoring pony at Training–Grand Prix (Freestyles, Walk Trot excluded) at each CDS recognized show will receive a High Score Pony Ribbon.

The shows should:

- 1. Identify the high scoring pony on their CDS COVER SHEET.
- 2. ATTACH a copy of the USEF DRESSAGE pony measurement card.

The CDS Central Office will send out the award to the pony rider. All pony riders should inform show management that they would like to be considered for the CDS Pony Award.

To be eligible, all ponies **must** have a current USEF DRESSAGE Pony Measurement Card.

If the pony is measured at a show and receives a temporary show measurement, that measurement will be good for all CDS shows during that show season.

CDS will also offer a Year End Award to the Highest Scoring Pony in Open, Amateur and Junior Divisions

Pony Measurement

Technical Delegates are certified to measure ponies with the USEF approved stick. Measuring must be performed by a TD, with the show veterinarian. In order to be officially measured, the pony must be entered in the competition. The owner must be a USEF member or pay a fee.

Dressage and/or DSHB competitions which offer classes or divisions limited to ponies are required to have an official measuring stick available and the TD must be on the Federation list of those approved to measure, or a licensed Steward must be present.

If classes restricted to ponies are not offered, the competitor is responsible for arranging the measurement and the cost of the on-call vet.

Adults and Juniors may show ponies in dressage. If you own a pony, read the entire section in the USEF Dressage Rules, www.usef.org.

CDS will accept temporary show measurements and the competitor may take that measurement form and use it for that show and any CDS show during the current show year. The USEF official DRESSAGE PONY measurement cards will be accepted as a valid card.

There are no courtesy or trial measurements. Once the show officials place the stick on the pony, the measurement is final.

Ponies must be re-measured annually until they reach the age of eight. Your responsibility as a pony owner and or rider:

- 1. Know the rules. If you have any questions, call USEF.
- If a pony class is offered at a show and your pony does not have a current measurement card, contact the show management to make sure they have an approved metric stick, and at the same time letting them know your pony needs to be measured prior to its class.

If you are in possession of a valid USEF DRESSAGE pony measurement card, then simply enclose a copy of it with your entry. USEF Compatition Name: Cascade Dressage I & II Compatition Division(s) and Rating(s): Dressage - Level 2 USEFe: 1121 & 323136

USDF Membership Benefits: USDF is dedicated to education, the recognition of achievement, and promotion of dressage. For details on member benefits, including educational programs, awards, and other opportunities, refer to the USDF Member Guide or the USDF website at www.usdf.org. This competition is recognized by USDF for 2022

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders

and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those
 sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at
 Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are
 exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot,
 academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM
 identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$90), 5-years (\$360), or life (\$1,800). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21* birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$72). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEFlicensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards Program and the USDF Regional Schooling Show Awards Program. Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$240) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$35 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$35). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded, but will NOT be counted towards Adequan[®]/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$80. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$115) is eligible for Adequan⁴/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualitying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

How to Join USDF

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

- On the USDF website: www.usdf.org. You can submit the application online or download the form and fax or mail it to the USDF office.
- In the show office at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions classified by USEF as Dressage Competitions, and Regular Competitions which are open to all breeds.

The effective date of membership is the date the form and correct fees are received in the USDF office or, if applying at a competition, the date accepted by the competition secretary, provided the application is signed and dated by the competition secretary, member, and/or horse owner on that same day.

2022 Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships

A single Regional Dressage Championship program organized by the United States Dressage Federation (USDF), and recognized by the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (USEF), will be held in each of the nine USDF regions. In addition, Alaska and Hawaii may each hold state championships if an official request from a Group Member Organization (GMO) is received by April 1 of the prior year. The Regional Championship Program Rules can be found on the USDF website at <u>www.usdf.org</u>. Please refer to the 2022 USDF Member Guide for the comprehensive list of rules and requirements for this program.

Membership/Registration Requirements for Qualifying and Championships

All memberships and registrations/recordings must be correct and current at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

Rider:

- Must have a USDF Participating* Membership (PM).
- Must have a USEF membership (Active or Life).

Horse:

- Must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR).
- Must have a USEF (Annual or Lifetime) Horse Recording.
- USDF horse registration and USEF horse recording must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s).
 A horse is not required to have breed registry papers.

Owner:

- Must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership and a USEF membership (Active or Life Membership or Annual or Life Recorded Farm/Business). If the horse has more than one owner, at least one owner must have both active USEF membership and active USDF Participating or Business Membership and must be the owner of record with USEF and USDF. For a business or farm to be the valid owner under this requirement, it must be listed as an owner of the horse with both USEF and USDF.
- * PMs are USDF members who join USDF directly. USDF Group Members (GM) are ineligible.

Minimum Qualifying Scores: One set of nationally-standardized qualifying scores has been established for all USEF/USDF Regional Championships, for Training Level through Grand Prix, in three divisions: open, adult amateur and junior/young rider. FEI Junior and FEI Young Rider classes have only one respective division. Freestyles have only open divisions.
