## **Research Evaluation Rubric**

What does the <b>title</b> tell you about the content?	<ul> <li>Look at the title of the book, journal, article, website, or the URL.</li> <li>A resource can have a great title but then be full of tangential ideas or not be related to your research – or vice versa – look deeper.</li> </ul>
Can you find information about the <b>author</b> ?	<ul> <li>Is the author named?</li> <li>Does the author have expertise on the subject?</li> <li>What are his/her qualifications? Look for information in the book or article.</li> <li>You can use Google or Google Scholar to find evidence of articles on the same subject by the author.</li> <li>Is there contact information on a website?</li> </ul>
What is the <b>date</b> ? Is there a <b>date</b> ?	<ul> <li>How current is the resource?</li> <li>Is it important that the information be current?</li> <li>Is there a date of the last update on a website?</li> </ul>
Who is the intended audience?	<ul> <li>Is the language simple or technical? Is it scholarly?</li> <li>Use Google to find information about a publication.</li> </ul>
How <b>relevant</b> is the resource?	<ul> <li>What is the resource about?         <ul> <li>For a book, check the table of contents and the index</li> <li>For an article, read the abstract, summary, and conclusion.</li> <li>For a website, check the home page for clues.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Is the subject applicable to your research?</li> </ul>
How <b>objective</b> is the content?	<ul> <li>What is the author's point of view?</li> <li>Is the resource well-researched and detailed?</li> <li>Or is it biased?</li> <li>Is the information the author's opinion or supported by facts?</li> <li>Are there advertisements or items for sale?</li> </ul>
Does the author document his or her sources?	<ul> <li>Are there references, citations or related sources of information?</li> <li>Are there footnotes?</li> </ul>
