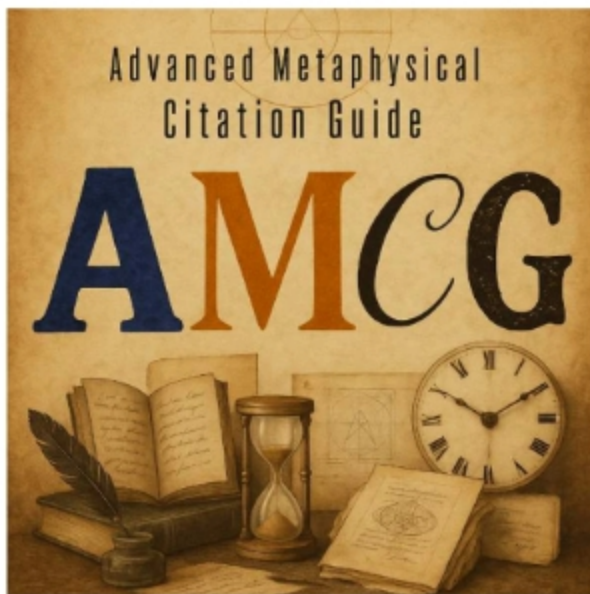
About the AMCG

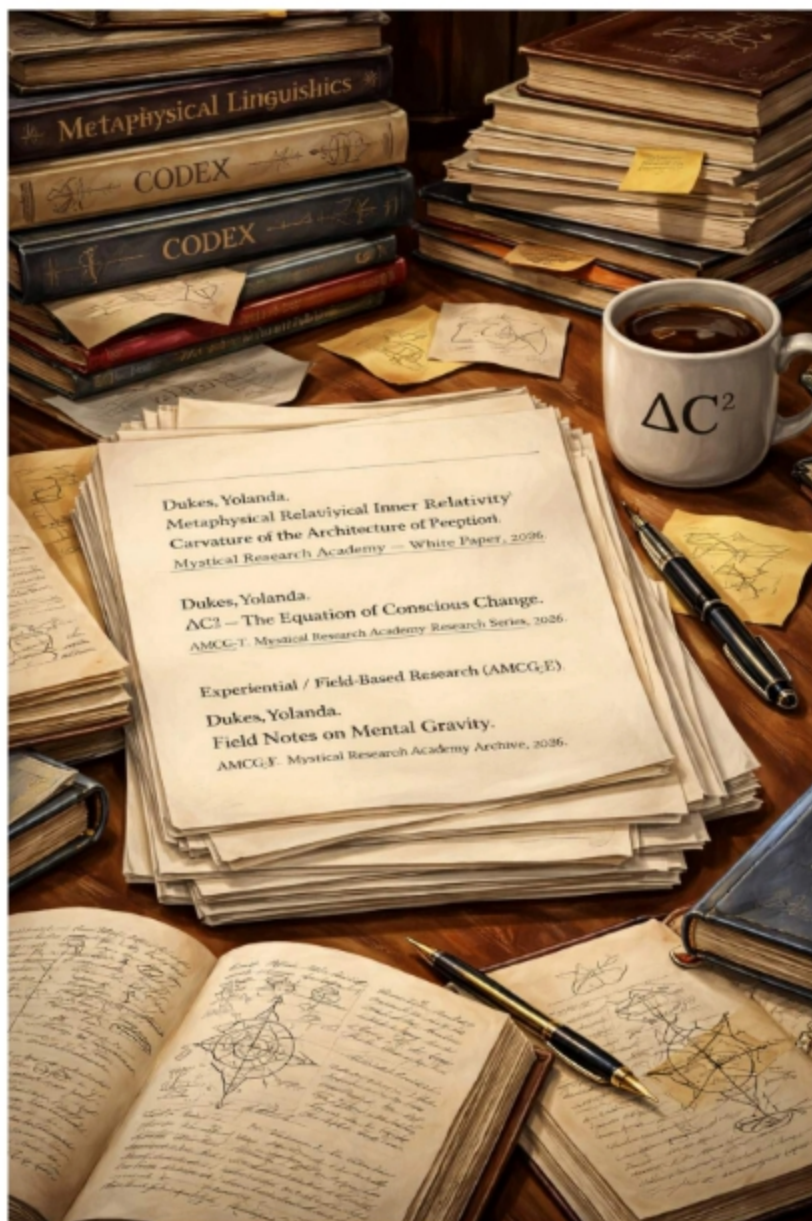
