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## Definition

### Language & Metaphysical Linguistics

The system of terminology through which metaphysical concepts are defined, clarified, and communicated with precision.

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## Simple Explanation

Every system depends on language.

Without clear definitions, concepts shift, meanings blur, and communication becomes unstable. The same word may carry different interpretations, leading to confusion even when discussing the same idea.

This section addresses that instability.

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# Core Principles

## **Definition Over Assumption**

Terms are explicitly defined rather than left open to interpretation.

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## **Consistency Over Variation**

Words maintain stable meaning across contexts.

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## **Precision Over Ambiguity**

Language is used carefully to reduce distortion and misunderstanding.

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## **Clarity Over Complexity**

Definitions remain simple without sacrificing depth.

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# Perspective

Language does not merely describe reality.  
It shapes how reality is interpreted.

When terms are undefined, meaning becomes fluid.  
When meaning is fluid, systems cannot stabilize.

Clarity in language does not limit thought.  
It strengthens it.
