RESURRECTION CHANGES EVERYTHING

Lenten Greetings,

I hope this message finds you well and that your Lenten season is drawing you closer to God. Our Sunday night study of "The Third Day" by Tom Berlin focused on Resurrection. We have explored this pivotal event through the perspectives of those who were there, such as Mary Magdalene, Simon Peter, and Thomas, among others. As we approach the day when we celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, I want to remind you that without the Resurrection, we have nothing.

Paul, in his first letter to the Church in Corinth, wrote:

"17 And if Christ is not risen, your faith is futile; you are still in your sins! 18 Then those who have fallen asleep in Christ have perished. 19 If in this life only we have hope in Christ, we are of all men the most pitiable."

— 1 Corinthians 15:17-19 (NKJV)

In the early church, some denied the claim of the Resurrection and tried to persuade others to follow their lead. For the Apostle Paul, the denial of the Resurrection was a "non-negotiable" issue, and it remains so for us today.

It was incredible, even hard to believe, for many that a mere man could rise from the dead. However, we know that Jesus Christ was more than just a man; He was the Son of God, who lived a sinless, blameless life and died on a cross like any criminal.

Paul emphasized that if we remove the Resurrection from the Gospel, our faith is futile, and we remain in our sins. But thank God, we are not still in our sins because we acknowledge and accept the message of the cross and the empty tomb!

The Resurrection changes everything! We now have freedom from sin and all the condemnation that accompanies it. As believers, we can take comfort in the assurance of our Salvation and the promise of Heaven as our future. We can hold onto hope for tomorrow, and we can share this message of freedom with others around us.

Paul boldly declares in the following verses:

20 But now Christ is risen from the dead and has become the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. 21 For since by man came death, by man also came the Resurrection of the dead. 22 For as in Adam all die, even so in Christ all shall be made alive."

— 1 Corinthians 15:20-22 (NKJV)

Jesus changes everything...let Him!



CHRISTIAN PASSOVER SEDER



As Baptists, we do not typically observe Passover or the Seder Meal. However, in the Christian tradition, the Passover Seder is believed to be the occasion when Jesus instituted the Eucharist, also known as Communion or the Lord's Supper. We know the story from Luke 22; Jesus was gathered around the table with the disciples,

15 And he said to them, "I have eagerly desired to eat this Passover with you before I suffer. 16 For I tell you, I will not eat it again."

Jesus then proceeded to give thanks, break bread, and serve the bread and cup. When we receive Communion, we celebrate the Last Supper and our Jewish heritage, which provides context for the meal.

We will offer a Seder meal and celebration on Maundy Thursday, April 17, at 6:00 p.m. in the fellowship hall.

Make plans to join this most sacred meal and invite a friend by reserving your place at the table. **Reservations are required** and must be made by April 13. You can contact the church office, Pastor Tracey, or use the reservation link on our Facebook page and website.

- 3. **Budgets Bring Clarity**: Having a budget provides clarity, ensuring that church finances are managed efficiently and avoiding confusion and potential financial disasters.
- 4. **Budgets** Streamline Finances: Creating a budget transforms chaotic financial management into a streamlined process, leading to better financial health and reduced stress for church leaders.
