THE HEART OF CHRISTMAS

Season's Greetings,

For centuries, the church has observed the season of Advent. Advent is Latin and means "the arrival." It is a time of waiting and preparing for both the Nativity of Christ and the return of Christ at the Second Coming. While the location was unexpected, His birth was not.

I have often wondered what people who are not Christ followers are celebrating when they celebrate Christmas. Year after year, our culture encourages us to focus on the gifts under our tree, the out-of-the-ordinary meals and charcuterie boards we will prepare, the cookies and other confections we will bake, traveling near and far to see family and friends, hosting house guests, and spending time with those we love. Some of us even put a little energy into wishing for snow.

Many have embraced a commercialized understanding of Christmas, which has altered the heart of the season. Gifts, culinary creations, cookies, and travel all seem to be the top things contributing to this time of year, making it the most wonderful time of the year. The Bible tells us that Christmas is about so much more. We turn to the traditional themes of Advent, hope, peace, joy, and love to understand the heart of Christmas. We will consider the themes of Advent until Christmas as follows:

God's faithfulness from the past gives us **Hope** for the present and the future.

Peace is not the absence of conflict; it is the presence of Christ.

The arrival of Jesus brings us **Joy** because he is the very presence of the divine.

Stop striving to gain God's approval. You are invited into His family by his grace and **Love**.

As we consider these themes each week, I hope you will consider what is at the heart of Christmas for you. I pray that we all will be moved in some way that will draw us closer to the heart of Christmas, which is Jesus Christ.
