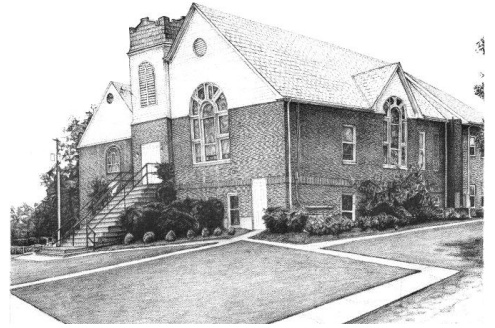

### WOMEN'S RETREAT

Ladies, are you ready to get away to refresh, refuel, and dive into your faith? Your opportunity to fellowship, worship, pray, serve, and study together is just around the corner.

To make plans, and before I sign any financial contracts, I need to know who is interested in going **as soon as possible**. Here are the details for the retreat:

Dates: February 17 – 19

Opening Session: 7 pm Thursday

Depart: Noon on Saturday

Venue: Williamsburg Christian Retreat Cntr (approximately an hour and a half away)

We will stay in a private cottage for just our group. It is equipped with a full kitchen, outdoor deck, large lounge area for fellowship and meeting, six bedrooms, each with a private bath.

Accommodations: 2 nights, quad rooms with bathroom, queen bed, and bunk beds. There is also a handicapped-accessible room.

(linens and towels are provided)

Transportation: carpool in private vehicles, church van if a driver is available.

Meals: Meal teams will be established to bring ingredients, prepare, and serve meals.

Cost: approx \$100-125\* per person (depending on how many sign-up to attend)

Commitment and a nonrefundable deposit of \$35 are due by Jan 10 to secure space. Balance due Feb 10. Minimum 15 required.

## DEACON TEAM MINISTRIES



**Love. Grow. Serve.**

The deacons participate in the deacon team ministry plan that focuses on the deacons, according to their gifts and calling, leading teams of congregation members in serving the church's needs. For this ministry to be successful, it is necessary that the deacons and congregational team members understand each Team's role and that the congregation invests their time on teams they feel gifted for service. ### Bereavement Team

The focus is persons affected by the death of an immediate family member (parent, spouse, or child). The Team delivers a box of items that might be of use during this time.

### Casserole Ministry Team

The focus is on persons affected by a crisis and/or upheaval of their regular schedule. The Team will provide food, home-cooked, purchased, or gift certificates, for those in times of crisis. The food is personally delivered by a member of the Team as person-to-person contact is another crucial element of the ministry.

## Hospital/Homebound Ministry Team

The focus of this Team is to minister to the members of Sycamore and their families who are homebound, in health care facilities, or retirement centers. The Team will contact those who are homebound, in the hospital, in a long-term care facility, or in retirement centers by visiting, calling, and/or sending cards.

### Prayer Ministry Team

The focus is on persons in need of intercessory prayer. The Team members participate by being notified when specific prayer needs are identified. Participation includes praying and/or contacting the person in need through cards, text, or phone calls. A prayer request may be made directly to the pastor, a prayer team leader, or a prayer team member through the prayer boxes in the elevator lobby and the vestibule in the community prayer box located at Checkerboard Corner or online through the church's website.

### Transportation Ministry Team

The focus is to provide transportation for people who need assistance with transportation to and from church, doctor appointments, hospital, etc. Those who need help may contact the team leader, the pastor, or any deacon, and arrangements will be made to meet your needs.
