CHILDREN'S MINISTRY



Our church continues to welcome and nurture children in the life of the church.

Back in October, we began offering a Children's Message during our Sunday services. This brief time is designed to help kids connect with the day's theme, Scripture, and God's love in a meaningful, age-appropriate way.

We're thankful for the children's participation and for the congregation's support as valued members of our worshipping family.

To help children engage during the service, we also now have new Kids' Worship Bags available each Sunday. These bags include quiet activities and "busy hands" items—simple toys and tools to help children stay calm, focused, and comfortable during worship. Families are welcome to pick up one by the piano when you arrive, and we appreciate your help in returning the bag and reusable items after worship so they can be refreshed and used again.

A reminder for families: Nursery care is available during worship for children from birth through Pre-K. Children in Kindergarten and older are encouraged to worship in the sanctuary with their families.

Children in Action have been enjoying learning and activities with Tricia on Wednesday evenings during Family Night.

We also continue to offer Sunday School classes for all ages, thanks to a team of prepared and dedicated leaders.
