# Worship and Picnic at the River Bronco Club 31040 Delaware Road October 10 – 11:00 a.m.

October 10<sup>th</sup> is set to be a busy but wonderful day of worship and fellowship as we gather down by the river. During our worship service, we will observe both ordination and communion. Following worship, we will enjoy lunch and a time of fellowship. I want to share with you a few details about our day together.

#### Ordination:

During worship, we will observe ordination as we ordain John Holland into the deacon ministry at Sycamore. Due to COVID, we will not practice the tradition of laying on hands and offering a personal blessing. We will invite John's family to lay hands while the rest of us offer prayers and petitions. Congregants will have the opportunity to leave written messages of encouragement and affirmation on note cards that John can take home to read and enjoy for years to come. You may pick up a printed notecard from the church or bring one of your own and place it in the designated basket.

#### Communion:

We will share communion during worship. We will exercise special care when we serve the elements. Ushers will invite you to come forward to receive the elements; please try to maintain proper spacing when waiting in line. You will be given a piece of bread, hands-free, and we will pour the juice into a cup that you bring with you from home. We will then partake of the elements together.

#### Lunch:

You are welcomed to pack a picnic lunch for you and your family to enjoy, or you can sign-up for a fried chicken lunch that will be provided and served by the deacons. Please be sure to sign up for your lunch plate no later than October 6<sup>th</sup>. After lunch, there will be a time of fellowship and games, and maybe even a little fishing.

This is an excellent opportunity to bring a friend, family member or neighbor to church. You will also need to bring your camp chair. I look forward to this day of worship and fellowship down by the river with each of you.

- ➤ The average Sunday School attendance for August was 38.
- ➤ The Nominating Committee needs to replace the chair for Food Services and bring to conference that Janie Brown and Diane Umphlett have volunteered to be co-chair again for the following year.
- The deacons will plan and serve lunch for the upcoming church picnic. A sign-up sheet will be posted so an exact number of those attending can be obtained. It was also mentioned that the Recreation committee might want to plan some activities for the afternoon.

- ➤ Tracey plans to be away from the pulpit on Sunday, October 17. Brian Williams will be here to speak.
