As I sat thinking about another Christmas that is coming rapidly upon us, I realized how many times the season has become special to me. There is no way to minimize the importance of celebrating the coming of Christ into our world, and every trip to the manger has the potential of becoming a pivotal point in our lives. Naturally, all of us also have our favorite Christmases. I simply want to share a few of mine. Naturally, I cannot share all the special ones, but some stand out in my memory. The first was the Christmas when I received my first Lionel electric train, a gift I now realize meant real sacrifices for my family to fulfill my desire. It's still in our attic, not because I still pull it out regularly, but because of the special memories.

The second Christmas that sticks with me was the first time I helped deliver Christmas baskets in my hometown and became aware of the poverty of some of those who lived in hidden spots I never visited before. I realized these people were literally dependent on the food we brought for their Christmas dinners, and the toys we shared would be all their children received. The next was the first Christmas I sang in the chorus of Handel's "Messiah." I had never worked so hard to learn music nor had I ever appreciated the meaning of Christmas more than when we finished with the "Hallelujah Chorus."

Another Christmas that stands out in my memory was the first Dawn and I spent together in our little apartment in Louisville, Kentucky. The tree was small, didn't have many lights, and was sparsely decorated. The presents were not very costly, but they were all we could afford. We felt blessed. I remember the first Christmas after Matthew was born when we laid him under the tree and looked in amazement at our most precious gift that Christmas. (I already know this Christmas will rank high, because it is our first with a granddaughter to love, and I can hardly wait.)

I also treasure some sad Christmases in my life. Three stand out for me. The first was the Christmas following my mom's death when we tried hard to create the perfect Christmas for my dad, but we didn't know the special touches to my mom's recipes. Then there was the Christmas after my dad died when we still had their house and tried to make it look cheery, but it was empty of the people who made it so rich. Then there was the Christmas when Dawn's dad was in the nursing home in the last stages of cancer. Each of those was hard, but in each I sensed the deep presence of the Christ who had come at the very first Christmas. He shared the joys and the pains with us.

As this Christmas nears, I pray that God will richly be in your life and that the baby of Bethlehem's manger will be the Lord of your life. May you find you own anchoring events that fill your life in this season. Many of the best are found in church, and I look forward to sharing this season with you as we join in remembering God's very best gift of the one who became as we are so that we might become as he is.
