Examples of Intimacy with God OT

The Old Testament provides numerous examples and teachings on the importance of intimacy with God. Abraham is called a "friend of God" (James 2:23), highlighting the personal nature of their relationship. Moses spoke with God "face to face, as a man speaks with his friend" (Ex. 33:11), indicating a level of intimacy that was unique and profound. David's psalms often express a deep longing for God's presence. In Psalms 63:1, David writes, "O God, You are my God; earnestly I seek You; my soul thirsts for You, my body longs for You, in a dry and weary land without water." This verse captures the essence of a heart yearning for closeness with God. As we seek a deeper, richer relationship with God we can bring these examples to Him in prayer, but always seeking the intimacy of the unique personal relationship He desires with us.

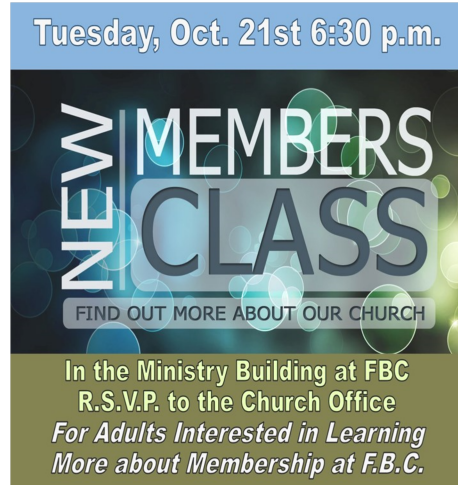
