Jesus' Example of Intimacy with God

Jesus Christ embodies the ultimate example of intimacy with the Father. He often withdrew to solitary places to pray (Lk 5:16), demonstrating the importance of personal communion with God. Jesus taught His disciples to abide in Him, as He abides in them, promising that such a relationship would bear much fruit (Jn 15:4-5). His prayers to the Father were bold, heartfelt and often intense (Jn 17, Lk 22:24). His prayers were answered and are being answered. He is beside the Father right now praying on our behalf. We don't have to work up an intimacy in prayer with God. Much like our salvation experience we need to simply accept His provision for us, rest in His care, and ask Him to help us follow His leading.

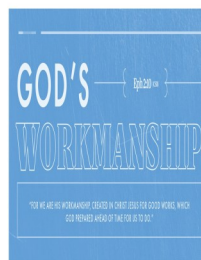

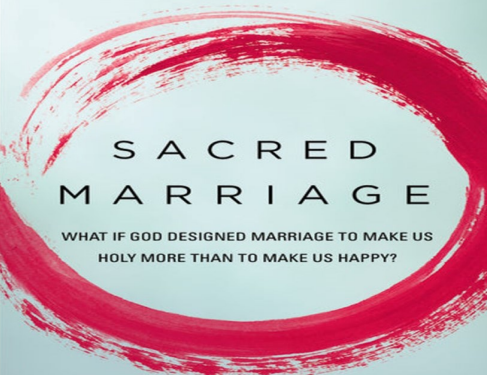
