Friends of Foster Kids Seeks Help for the Holidays

Friends of Foster Kids, a Macomb County non-profit organization founded by Theresa Toia, helps to provide a "Christmas" for foster children that have been removed from the their homes due to abuse and/or neglect and placed in temporary housing.

"Unfortunately, these events happen so quickly that often times, these children have no opportunity to gather their belongings. Basic necessities that we take for granted like clothing, underwear, pillows and photos are all little things that help them feel safe and secure," says Toia.

There is no funding or special program that can help, so Friends of Foster Kids requests help from the community. Toia says, "The children's needs include clothing, personal care items, pillows and blankets. We are also in need of donations to provide duffel bags for the children to keep their belongings in, live out of and remain mobile as they are moved from place to place. Wrapping paper, pretty ribbons, bows and the need for volunteers are also appreciated to bring it all together."

To help with the "Spirit of Christmas" program, visit their website (friendsoffosterkids.org) to wrap Christmas presents for children in the foster system program. Guidelines from their website are:

• "All volunteers must sign up so we can be certain we have space for all.

All volunteers must be 14 years old or older."

The nonprofit group needs volunteers from Nov. 30 through Dec.18 and many slots are still open. They are always in great need of clothing boxes and wrapping paper. "We would truly appreciate if you can bring some with you, when you volunteer," says Toia.

Lasagne Love Gives Back to Metro Detroit

Reaching across continents, Lasagna Love has now touched over 2 million people facing hardship with home-cooked lasagnas, marking a significant milestone in its global mission of kindness and community support.

Since its founding in 2020, Lasagna Love has rapidly grown from a local community effort into a significant force for combating hunger, loneliness, and general need. Expanding beyond the United States, Lasagna Love now also operates in Canada and Australia, driven by over 56,000 volunteers.

Italian-American Maureen Feuti is the local leader for Metro Detroit-East ad Port Huron. She and her group

attended the Italian Festival at Freedom Hill and she says, "We got several volunteers from the festival." However many more volunteers are needed.

In the United States, food insecurity affects over 44.2 million people, including more than 7.3 million children, demonstrating a dire need for direct community support according to the 2022 USDA report.

Lasagna Love's unique direct-to-need model not only meets this demand for nourishment but also bridges community gaps, bringing people together at a time when connection is more important than ever.
