### Confusion in the Tulpehocken Valley 1735

**Sunday, September 19, 10 a.m.**

Our area, known then as the Tulpehocken (Dalpehacken), was the "Wild Wild West" of Pennsylvania – no towns to speak of – no Lebanon, Myerstown, etc. The area's nascent church had been founded in 1727 by the church planter, Rev. John Phillip Boehm. Soon after, a new Reformed minister, Rev. Peter Miller, served the churches. In 1732, he became enamored with the Ephrata Cloister sect, left his post, and became a hermit. In 1735, he held a public burning of hymnals and the Heidelberg and Lutheran catechisms and convinced ten families to join the Cloister with him, including the very famous Conrad Weiser.

Pastor Farrell has studied and published on Boehm's life. He will preach in the clothing of that era, acting as if it is 1735. As "Rev. Boehm" he will gather the flock in worship to quiet them and warn them of the errors of this action. Come and be challenged for today by this unique service.
