PASTORAL INVITATION TO THE COMMUNION TABLE

Jesus was always the guest. In the homes of Peter and Jairus, Martha and Mary, Joanna and Susanna, He was always the guest. At the meal tables of the wealthy where he pled the case of the poor, He was always the guest. Upsetting polite company, befriending isolated people, welcoming the stranger, He was always the guest. But here, at this table, Jesus is the host.

Those who wish to serve Him must first be served by Him. Those who want to follow Him must first be fed by Him. Those who would wash His feet must first let Him make them clean. For this is the table where God intends us to be nourished. This is the time when Christ can make us new. So come, you who hunger and thirst for a deeper faith, for a fuller life, for better world. Jesus Christ, Who has sat at our tables, now invites us to be guests at His.
