ADVENT CANDLE LIGHTING

[Titus 3, Isaiah Psalm 96:1-3, 7-9, 10a, 11a, 13b]

- Reader 1: On the first Sunday of Advent, we lit a candle for Hope. [*The first candle is lit*.] On the second Sunday, we lit a candle for Peace. [*The second candle is lit*.] On the third Sunday, we lit a candle for Joy. [*The pink candle is lit*.] Last Sunday, we lit a candle for Love. [*The last candle is lit*.]
- Reader 2: Now the time has come to light a candle for Christ. [*The Christ Candle is lit.*] The season of watching and waiting is over. When the kindness and love of God our Savior appeared, He saved us, not because of righteous things we had done, but because of His mercy... through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit, Whom He poured out on us generously through Jesus Christ our Savior. The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light. This is the light of the world and darkness cannot extinguish it.
- Reader 3: As the angels sing, the shepherds draw near, and the Magi offer their gifts, we, too, are here with Jesus to offer our gifts and sing praise to God as they did so long ago in Bethlehem. Sing to the Lord a new song... all the earth. Tell of His salvation. Declare His glory among the nations, His marvelous works among all the peoples. Ascribe to the Lord glory and strength. Worship the Lord in holy splendor. Tremble before Him. Say among the nations, 'The Lord is King!' Let the heavens be glad and let the earth rejoice. He will judge the world with righteousness and the peoples with His truth".

All: Unto us a Savior is born is born!

#### LOVE IS HERE

#### GOD'S WORD

- adapted from John 1:1, 4-5, 9, 14; Luke 2:1-7; Matthew 1:22-23; 1 Timothy 1:15

- Reader 1: In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.
- Reader 2: He was with God in the beginning. In Him was life, and that life was the light of all people.
- Reader 3: The light shines in the darkness and the darkness has not overcome it. The true light that gives light to everyone was coming into the world.

# All: The Word became flesh and made His dwelling among us.

- Reader 2: We have seen His glory, the glory of the one and only Son, Who came from the Father, full of grace and truth.
- Reader 1: In those days, Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world.
- Reader 3: This was the first census that took place while Quirinius was governor of Syria. And all went to their town to register.

- Reader 1: So Joseph went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to Bethlehem the town of David, because he belonged to the house and line of David. He went there to register with Mary, who was pledged to be married to him and was expecting a child.
- Reader 2: All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet: "The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and they will call him Emmanuel" (which means "God with us").
- Reader 3: Here is a trustworthy saying that deserves full acceptance: Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners.
- Reader 1: While they were there, the time came for the baby to be born, and she gave birth to her firstborn, a son. She wrapped Him in cloths and placed Him in a manger because there was no guest room available for them.

#### GOD'S WORD

Luke 2:8-20

- Reader 1: There were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks at night. An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them,
- Reader 2: "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people. Today, in the town of David, a Savior has been born to you. He is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign to you: You will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger."
- Reader 1: Suddenly a great company of the heavenly host appeared with the angel praising God and saying,
- All: "Glory to God in the highest heaven and on earth, peace to those on whom His favor rests."
- Reader 3: When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another,
- Reader 1: "Let's go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened which the Lord has told us about."
- Reader 3: So they hurried off and found Mary and Joseph and the baby, Who was lying in the manger. When they had seen Him, they spread the word concerning what had been told them about this Child and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds said to them.
- Reader 2: But Mary treasured up all these things and pondered them in her heart. The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all the things they had heard and seen, which were just as they had been told.

<sup>4</sup> Silent night! Holy night! Wondrous star, lend thy light. With the angels let us sing "Alleluia" to our King. Christ the Savior is born! Christ the Savior is born!
