***THE INVITATION**

PASTORAL CALL TO CONFESSION

[1 Corinthians 11: 27-29; Revelation 3:19]

So then, whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of sinning against the body and blood of the Lord. Everyone ought to examine themselves before they eat of the bread and drink from the cup. For those who eat and drink without discerning the body of Christ, eat and drink judgment on themselves. Those whom I love I rebuke and discipline. So be earnest and repent.

RESPONSIVE CONFESSION

[from today's texts] Pastor: We do not always exalt You and praise Your name. We forget to rejoice and be glad in Your salvation. People: You are deserving of all honor, trust and reverence; we neglect to give You these.

Pastor: You came to seek and to save all the lost. Our deeds are lukewarm.

People: You ask us to be Your Body here, but we do not provide a refuge for the poor and needy.

Pastor: We want to see You, but don't go out of our way very often. We don't welcome You gladly.

People: We don't keep our eyes on the prize, training well to be victorious.

Pastor: We, too, can mutter, "He has gone to be the guest of a sinner."

*DECLARATION OF FAITH

[Heidelberg Catechism Questions 65, 66, 76] People: From where does the faith alone that we share in Christ and all His benefits come?

Pastor: The Holy Spirit produces it in our hearts¹ by the preaching of the holy gospel,² and confirms it by the use of the holy sacraments.3 ¹John 3:5; 1 Cor. 2:10-14; Eph. 2:8 ²Rom. 10:17; 1 Pet. 1:23-25 ³Matt. 28:19-20; 1 Cor. 10:16

People: What are sacraments?

Pastor: Sacraments are visible, holy signs and seals instituted by God. By our use of them, God might make us understand more clearly the promise of the gospel and also seal His promise to us:¹ to grant us forgiveness of sins and eternal life by grace because of Christ's one sacrifice accomplished on the cross.² Gen. 17:11; Deut. 30:6; Rom. 4:11 Matt. 26:27-28; Acts 2:38; Heb. 10:10 People: What does it mean to eat the crucified body of Christ and to drink His poured-out blood? Pastor: It means to accept with a believing heart the entire suffering and death of Christ and thereby to receive forgiveness of sins and eternal life.¹ But it means more. As we share in His suffering, we proclaim Christ will come again And we'll join in the feast of heaven around the table of the King, around the table the King.
