Our Mission

As educators our mission is to create **hyper-local and self-sustaining**, special education communities. Through high quality training, hands-on support and a people-first focus, we are creating a strong foundation for future generations within the special education community. Our vision is equitable access to special education services and resources. We believe that **empowering and fostering professionals and advocates** in the community will support and serve its youngest members. With equity, advocacy, and empowerment at our core, driving all of our decision-making and focusing our course, we know that a more equitable special education system in New York City is possible.


Our Early Intervention Program will provide per year

- 26,000 hours of direct **Applied Behavior Analysis**
- 23,000 hours of Speech Therapy
- 19,500 hours of Occupational Therapy

to over 200 children of the Bronx per year that are **currently receiving ZERO hours** due to the lack of trained professionals living in, or willing to travel to the Bronx.

Our Training & Excellence Program will each year

- Employ 60-80 Bronx community members
- Provide **paid training** to, and through, **certification** as registered Behavior Technicians.
- Through community partnerships we secure higher paying career opportunities and placements.



We believe that **equity in education is a fundamental human right**, and the disparity in access, resources, and quality, among the five boroughs, disproportionately impacts families in the Bronx. We are the only sustainable corrective action to close that gap.

• Our overall goal for our Bronx center is that for each year of operation we will increase the participation rate of early intervention in the Bronx by 2% and adding 40 new certified professionals per cycle.
