Phyllis Allen

Phyllis trained and danced with Atlanta Civic Ballet (now Atlanta Ballet) under directors Dorothy Alexander and Robert Barnett. She was chosen at age 15 by George Balanchine for his Young Choreographers Workshop. She studied at the School of American Ballet (SAB) and the Royal Ballet School. After a varied performing career in dance and musical theatre, she began the Lawrenceville School of Ballet. She was the founding director of Southern Ballet Theatre and has taught many students that have gone on to careers in dance, theater, teaching, choreography and directing.

Abigail Tan Gamino

Abi grew up in Manila, Philippines and trained at the school of Phillipine Dance
Theatre. She was invited to join PDT at 15 and a few years later accepted a company
position at American Repertory Ballet in New Jersey. After one year at ARB, she was offered

Barocco. Since retiring from performing, she has served as senior faculty at Atlanta Ballet
Center for Dance Education and she graduated with a BA in Communication Arts from
Angelicum College.
