Principal Report: Kim Boling

- Letter grades came in! ALL CFSD schools got an A rating!
 - Letter grades is based off performance on statewide assessments, Significant student growth, Students on track to proficiency and overall performance higher than state average
 - o 50% of grade based on student growth
 - 30 % based on proficiency
 - 10% based on EL
 - 10% based on acceleration/readiness (part of this is chronic absenteeism)
- Last letter grade was given in 2018-2019 (A)
 - 2019/20 awarded same letter grade as previous year du eto school closures
 2020/21 letter grades paused.
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- Chronic absenteeism
 - is considered missing 10% or more days out of 180 school days or 18+ days Missed.
 - chronically absence in pre-k and 1st ess likely to read at grade level by 3rd grade
 - students who cannot read at grade level by end of 3rd grade are 4x more likely than proficient readers to drop out of high school
 - irregular attendance can be better predictor of whether students will drop out before graduation than test scores
 - Frequent absences shape adulthood
 - Chronic Absenteeism has been linked to poor socioemotional outcomes
 - Students who are chronically absent may be retained
 - Nationwide over 7 million students missed 15 or more days of school in 2015-2016 (16% of student population)

- At Manzanita 258 students missed 18+ days during 2021-2022 school year—-42% of enrolled students!
- Manzanita did not receive points for Acceleration/readiness in 2021-2022 because absentee rate either did not decrease or was not less than 4%
- thank you for making attendance a priority. Missing school means missing special moments that cannot be made up with work done at home
