Would you like to specialise in psychodynamic psychotherapy as part of your Registrar Program?

The Psychodynamic Psychotherapy Registrar Program, now in its third year, has been specifically designed for Psychology Registrars who wish to develop a solid foundation in and ability to formulate and practice effectively from a relational psychodynamic perspective, whilst also meeting their AHPRA requirements for practice endorsement.

The two-year program will introduce you to evidenced-based relational psychodynamic modalities of thinking and practice highlighting the ways in which early developmental experiences predispose, precipitate and perpetuate many psychological and psychiatric difficulties along with how to address these therapeutically.

The course provides a comprehensive & immersive learning experience, equipping you with essential skills & knowledge to seamlessly integrate psychodynamic principles into your practice and at the same time, to encourage the development of your professional identity as a relational psychodynamic practitioner by providing a community of practice.

A two year small group learning course offered in person or online

- Build and establish a safe and supportive professional peer group
- Connect with experienced psychodynamically oriented clinicians
- Accrue your AHPRA board required CPD and **Group Supervision hours**

The Program is limited to 8 Registrars to ensure a small group learning approach that is intimate, private, safe, collaborative and interactive.

- Cultivate the ability to establish and maintain effective therapeutic relationships.
- Gain competence in psychodynamic assessment techniques and case formulation.
- Acquire practical skills in applying psychodynamic interventions

Program Structure

The program spans two years, each comprising four 8-week modules. Each module consists of eight 2-hour seminars that integrate theory with applied clinical practice through assigned readings, case presentations, and interactive discussions.

This structure provides a comprehensive, progressive learning experience, moving from foundational knowledge to advanced, specialised applications of psychodynamic psychotherapy.
