Upon arrival in Geneva, Switzerland we were supposed to be met by a hired van to take us to the language center in Albertville, France. Turns out he came and went. But Tim was able to hire a driver who gave us a great price. As our luggage was packed into the van, it looked as though we weren't all going to fit, but we just squeezed in. It was a mercy that those three pieces of luggage didn't make it, because we definitely would not have all fit! The missing luggage was delivered to our door via UPS the next day!

Our first week has been full of getting settled at the language center where Tim and I will be studying (and where our family is living on-campus for the year), registering the two older girls for school, getting cell phones figured out, shopping for groceries and supplies for our house, finding the best baguettes in town (a must), and learning how to navigate the town on bikes and on foot.

In the last month before moving, we have experienced a peace that passes all understanding. While we had moments of stress and feeling like time was getting away from us, the overall feeling we had as we packed up or donated the last of our belongings was peace that God has been, is, and will lead us each step of the way. Even now, in Albertville, with school starting for all of us (except Eleanor, who will be in nursery at the language center) with new and unexpected things happenings daily, we have peace that God has led us to this place and this year of further preparation is for His good and glory.
