THE HEALING OF THE PARALYTIC

This account unfolds in Capernaum, where Jesus is teaching in a crowded home. the friends of a paralyzed man go to great lengths to bring him to Jesus, even breaking through the roof to lower him into the presence of the Lord.



The powerful act of their intercession emphasizes the communal aspect of faith- how believers are called to carry one another in prayer, especially those burdened by sin or suffering. When Jesus sees their faith, He responds not by immediately healing the man's body, but by first forgiving his sins. This significant gesture highlights that spiritual healing is of greater importance than physical restoration. By declaring, "Son, your sins are forgiven," Jesus reveals His divine identity, since only God has the power to forgive sins. In the Maronite tradition, this Gospel passage emphasizes Jesus as the Divine Physician who restores wholeness to those who trust in Him. The man's rising symbolizes the believer's call to new life to rise from the paralysis of sin and walk in the light of God's grace. The friends' unwavering determination reflects the Church's mission to support one another in faith, reminding us that healing often comes through communal prayer, compassion, and acts of love. This miracle invites the faithful to trust in Christ's mercy, seek His forgiveness, and become instruments of healing in the lives of others.





How did Ephrem understand himself? He informs us that he has the anointing of heaven, that he speaks for God, that the power that animates and enlivens scripture flows into him, and through him, into his own time. But there are skeletons in his closet: Ephrem carries a dark secret from his past.

Why Ephrem Matters 1:00-2:30 pm

Ephrem's vision offers a path that is simple but hard. It is not the path of orthodoxy (right doctrine) or orthopraxy (right morality) but of orthopathy (authentic spirituality), which is nothing less than an embrace of ROZO.






