**LITURGICAL REFLECTION**

**This Wednesday, March 6, is Ash Wednesday when the Church begins the forty day journey toward the Triduum (The Three Days) with the annual discipline of fasting, praying and giving alms. Ash Wednesday (March 6) and Good Friday (April 19) are days of fast and abstinence. All Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence. FASTING refers to only one full meal, with two small meals and no eating otherwise for the day. ABSTINENCE refers to not eating meat at all during the day. All who have reached their 14<sup>th</sup> year are obliged to ABSTAIN. The Church directs the holy FAST to all those in their 18<sup>th</sup> year until their 60<sup>th</sup> year. The ancient practice of fasting and abstaining can occur throughout other days in Lent. This is not obligatory and can take a variety of forms distinct from food.**

STARTING THIS FRIDAY, MARCH 8

Our fish dinners are every Friday during Lent starting Friday, March 8 and including Good Friday, April 19. Take out begins at 3:30 and eat-in at 4:30. We have always claimed to be the BEST fish dinner in town. The price of fish has gone up 26.50%. We will raise our meal price only 10.50%. The price for an adult meal is \$10.50, up \$1.00 from the last 8 years and a child meal is \$7.50. We continue to use the same haddock fish baked or hand dipped fried, homemade mac & cheese, hand cut fries, homemade stewed tomatoes, applesauce, coleslaw, homemade dessert, and drink.
