GROUND RULES: Only actual contestant and one companion allowed gate access. Contestants will have access to one rodeo ticket for the rounds in which they are competing. Companion passes are not allowed to enter Dickies Arena without a ticket. PRCA members not entered in the rodeo will not be permitted to enter Dickies Arena with a PRCA card.

ALL EVENTS - The "30-hour replacement" policy will be in effect in conjunction with ground rule for replacements inside of 30 hours. See Rodeo Entry Information page of the business journal.

ALL EVENTS - The "walk-up replacement" policy will be in effect. See Rodeo Entry Information section of the business journal.

ALL EVENTS - Re-entries will be accepted for available positions on Tues., Dec. 23 between 9 AM and 11 AM. See Rodeo Entry Information page of the business journal.

TRADE DEADLINE - Trades can be made up to 4:00 PM CST (which is 3:00 PM MT) the evening prior to round 1 of each bracket in which the contestant is scheduled to compete.

ALL EVENTS: No permits will be accepted as entries at Fort Worth with the following exception. If a permit member qualifies through one of the seven qualifying rodeos, he will be accepted as an entry at Fort Worth.

ALL EVENTS - There will be an extended grace period for those contestants who are entered and meet qualifications to change preferences Fri., Dec. 19 between 10 AM and 5 PM.

ALL CONTESTANTS - All contestants must sign a release of liability and other forms provided by the Rodeo Secretary before competing. If a contestant chooses not to compete for a "non-injury" related reason, that contestant will be ineligible to compete in any FWSSR event for the remainder of the current year, plus the following year. In the event of a turn-out in Round 1 of each bracket, the next ranking contestant on the alternate list will be used as a replacement.

ALL CONTESTANTS - All contestants must wear the back number provided by the FWSSR Rodeo Secretary which must be visible at all times upon entrance to Dickies Arena to gain entry to Dickies Arena floor, including: locker rooms, rodeo arena floor, stalling area, secretary's office, rodeo hospitality and all rodeo related locations within Dickie Arena, whether competing or not. For security reasons, contestants will likely be asked for identification. If the contestant is wearing a jacket or vest, the back number must be pinned to the outside of the jacket or vest.

ALL CONTESTANTS - Enter the grounds via Gate 44 at Harley Avenue and Trail Drive - 3350 Trail Drive, Fort Worth, TX 76107. FWSSR staff will provide further directions on parking at this point. Unload horses and tack in stalls provided. Trailers must be moved immediately to the designated contestant parking lot. Contestant parking lot is secured 24 hours a day. Any trailer unhooked from vehicle that is not within the designated contestant parking lot will be towed at owner's expense. Vehicles will park in designated contestant parking lot. Overnight camping on show ground will only be allowed in the designated contestant parking lot. RV hookups will be available at no charge in contestant parking lot, Gate 52, for a maximum period of 24 hours around the contestant's scheduled performance(s). Contestants will be allowed into the contestant parking lot on a first come, first served basis - no reservations accepted.

ALL EVENTS - Hazers, pushers, rope pullers, saddle/rigging cinchers and contestant assistants not entered will obtain credentials from the rodeo secretary's office. To obtain credentials, the individual(s) must be a member of the PRCA with PRCA insurance dues paid for the current year. Individuals without the proper credentials will not be permitted onto the floor level of Dickies Arena, into the rodeo arena, behind the bucking chutes, behind the timed event boxes or in any support alley's or facilities.

ALL CONTESTANTS WITH HORSES - Must have Certificate of Veterinary Inspection issued within thirty (30) days and negative Equine Infectious Anemia (EIA) test, also known as a "Coggins" test, within the past twelve (12) months. Proof of Coggins test must be presented in either the original document or copy of the original document that has been approved by the Texas Animal Health Commission. Test date, accession number and name of

laboratory must be listed on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection. Exemption: Equine may enter shows, fairs, exhibitions or assemblies without a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection when accompanied by a valid equine interstate passport or equine identification card and a completed VA form 10-11 showing negative results to an official EIA test within the previous six (6) months.

STALLS - Contestants shall stall their horses in Dickies Arena stalling area set aside for rodeo contestants. If demand of stalls exceeds supply of stalls in Dickies Arena, contestants will be directed to the Horse Show Office where, upon availability, they will be assigned a stall(s) for their use. Stalls will be available at no charge for a maximum period of 24 hours around the contestant's performance(s). Horses must be stalled in assigned stalls. Horses are not to be stalled or tied to livestock pens or warmup arena panels.

QUALIFICATIONS: BB, SB, BR, TD & SW - 56 minimum entries. No compensation. No exemptions. No slack. E/F's \$250. The top 48 from 2025 money won that enter will be accepted. The champion contestants from each event during the PRCA sanctioned FWSSR Rookie event will be accepted (drop down until filled). The champion contestants from these 7 PRCA rodeos in 2025 that enter will be accepted (drop down until filled): Parker County Sheriff's Posse Frontier Days and PRCA Rodeo in Weatherford; Gladewater Round-Up Rodeo; Wichita Falls PRCA Rodeo; Mineral Wells Rodeo; Johnson County Sheriff's Posse Rodeo in Cleburne; Ellis County Fair and Rodeo in Waxahachie; North Texas State Fair and Rodeo in Denton. If a contestant qualifies in both categories (2025 money won and champion contestant at one of the 7 rodeos) he will assume the position among the 2025 money won qualifiers and the next highest ranked contestant or team from that rodeo who entered will be accepted. In the event that one or more of the listed qualifier rodeos is cancelled for any reason during the 2025 rodeo season, the next highest ranked contestant on the alternate list (based on 2025 money won) will be accepted.

ALL EVENTS: The qualifiers from each of the 7 qualifying rodeos will be required to compete in the specific performances designated by the committee for those respective rodeos. In the team roping, if a team qualifies from one of the 7 qualifying rodeos and the two partners from that team are each roping with different partners at Fort Worth, both re-formed teams will be required to compete in the specific performance designated by the committee for that respective qualifier rodeo.

TR - 56 minimum entries. Only two loops allowed. No compensation. No exemptions. No slack. E/F's \$250. The top 48 headers based on 2025 money won as a header only, and the top 48 heelers based on 2025 money won as a heeler only that enter will be accepted. The champion team from the TR event from the PRCA sanctioned FWSSR Rookie event will be accepted (drop down until filled). The champion teams from these 7 PRCA rodeos in 2025 that enter will be accepted: Parker County Sheriff's Posse Frontier Days and PRCA Rodeo in Weatherford; Gladewater Round-Up Rodeo; Wichita Falls PRCA Rodeo; Mineral Wells Rodeo; Johnson County Sheriff's Posse in Cleburne; Ellis County Fair and Rodeo in Waxahachie; North Texas State Fair and Rodeo in Denton. If a header or heeler qualifies in both categories (2025 money won and champion at one of the 7 rodeos) he will assume the position among the 2025 money won qualifiers. The 56 headers who qualify must rope with the 56 heelers who qualify. If a contestants' partner is drawn out due to qualification, the contestant who qualified will not be allowed to draw out. Contestants who do not have partners after the contestant list has been determined will be allowed to designate partners during the extended grace period on Fri., Dec. 19 between 10 AM and 5 PM. After the expiration of the grace period, a random draw by PROCOM will determine which headers who are not entered with a partner will rope with which heelers who are not entered with a partner. If a header or heeler notifies a TO, WIR, DR, or DO prior to the 30-hour deadline, leaving an incomplete team, the next contestant in the corresponding category (header or heeler) on the alternate list of contestants that were drawn out due to qualification, will be added to the team (any TO, VIR, or DO notification made through PROCOM will be final). If a notification is not made prior to the 30-hour deadline, the remaining partner may select another partner from among any of the PRCA event contestants already entered at the rodeo, except those scheduled to compete in the TR. No partners can be replaced after a team has competed in round 1 of each bracket. In the event that one or more of the listed qualifier rodeos is canceled for any reason during the 2025 rodeo season, the next highest ranked contestant on the alternate list based on 2025 money won will be accepted.

ALL EVENTS - If first place at one of the seven qualifying rodeos is tied and none of the tied contestants are already qualified among the top 48 from 2025 money won, the tied contestant with the highest ranking based on 2025 money won will be accepted. If there is a tie in the Team Roping for first place at one of the seven qualifying rodeos, the highest ranked header and the highest ranked heeler from the tied teams based on 2025 money won will be accepted.

BR - No sharp spurs. Judges will inspect spurs prior to the first go-round of each bracket.

BB, SB, BR - Any contestant awarded a re-ride option and whose equipment is broken must immediately repair and/or find replacement equipment.

RE - Riding event stock will be drawn after the trade deadline the night before the respective bracket. All trades must be confirmed prior to the stock draw for the first go-round of each bracket.

RE - Two re-rides will be available (and on site) for each round for each of the riding events. In addition, two more re-rides will be designated to be used "only if needed", in the case that one or more of the two originally designated re-rides are used to replace a sick or injured animal that was drawn by a contestant. If in the event that

more re-rides are awarded than there are re-ride animals available, additional re-rides will be drawn from animals in the re-ride pool.

RE - Riding event pens and re-ride orders to be set by FWSSR producer. Rodeo producer will consult with RE representatives when selecting RE stock.

TE - Stock contractor to provide one animal for every entry, plus adequate extras.

SW - The steer must fall, clean when the throw is attempted. If a clean fall is not achieved, and the motion stops, the steer must be allowed to regain his feet before being thrown. If the steer is not allowed to regain his feet when instructed by the judge, the contestant will be disqualified.

TE - If a timed event animal escapes or a re-run is awarded for any reason, the extra will be used. Only escaped animals go back into the herd.

TD - There will be a disqualification for a jerk down as long as all criteria are in compliance with the jerk down policy.

BB, SB, BR-If an individual is taking advantage of the contestants in that event and/or the livestock and/or the rodeo production and/or not cooperating with the chute boss's and judges' instructions resulting in an attempt to cheat or influence the results of the event, to include but not limited to causing an animal to act up or be unruly in the chute in order to receive a re-ride, that individual will be disqualified by the judges from that round and for subsequent offenses will be disqualified by the judges from that event for the remainder of the rodeo.

For contestants, the definition of "ready when called" shall be: **BB:** The contestant must be over the horse with his hand in the rigging when the previous horse leaves the arena. If the contestant is first to compete, this would be when the flag horse leaves the arena or as instructed by the chute boss and/or judges. If a contestant has a fair opportunity to compete and does not call for his competition animal, delaying the production of the rodeo, the same ruling will apply. **SB:** The contestant must have the horse cinched (front & rear) with the rein measured, and be in the chute, mounting the horse when the previous horse leaves the arena. If the contestant is first to compete, this would be when the flag horse leaves the arena or as instructed by the chute boss and/or judges. If a contestant has a fair opportunity to compete and does not call for his competition animal, delaying the production of the rodeo, the same ruling will apply. **BR:** The contestant must be pulling the rope when the previous bull leaves the arena. If the contestant is first to compete, this would be when the flag horse leaves the arena or as instructed by the chute boss and/or judges. If a contestant has a fair opportunity to compete and does not call for his competition animal, delaying the production of the rodeo, the same ruling will apply. A contestant not ready when called during a performance or section of slack will be fined \$250 for the first offense; \$500 for the second offense; and \$1,000 for the third and subsequent offenses, and/or may be disqualified from the rodeo.

TE - If in the opinion of the chute boss and/or the judges, if a contestant is not "ready when called" the contestant will be subject to a penalty. By definition, "ready when called" shall mean that the contestant must be riding into the box when the previous animal leaves the arena. If a contestant is the first contestant in team roping and tie-down roping, they shall be riding into the box, and in steer wrestling, riding into the arena when the flag (sponsor) horse leaves the arena or as instructed by the chute boss and/or judges. Contestants must take their stock within 45 seconds of receiving the "all clear" from the designated judge. If the contestant exceeds the time limit, except in case of mechanical failure or a problem with the competition animal in the timed event chute in the opinion of the judges. For every 20 seconds over the 45-second limit, the fine will be progressively doubled. If a contestant exceeds two minutes in the box it will result in disqualification from the round. A contestant not ready when called during a performance or section of slack will be fined \$250 for the first offense; \$500 for the second offense; and \$1000 for the third and subsequent offenses, and/or may be disqualified from the rodeo.

ALL EVENTS - If a re-ride or re-run is awarded for any reason, it may take place before the next event.

ALL EVENTS - Once the run or ride has been completed, contestants must promptly exit the arena.

ALL CONTESTANTS - Must compete in all brackets and rounds in order to advance to the wild card, semi-finals and/or finals (does not include DR's or VIR's or 2nd go-round replacements).

FORMAT - All events. 18 total performances - 7 brackets of eight (8) contestants or teams competing in 2 rounds back to back each will account for the first 14 performances, 1 Wild Card Round for performance 15, 2 Semi-Finals for performances 16 and 17 and 1 Finals Round for performance 18. The top 2 money winners (14 total) in each bracket will advance to compete in one of the semi-finals performances (8 contestants or teams per performance). The third top money winner from each bracket (7 total) will advance to the Wild Card Round which will also consist of one round. The remaining non-qualifiers from each bracket that did not advance will be placed into a pool of non-qualifiers. At the conclusion of bracket 7, the top money winner from the pool of non-qualifiers will advance to the Wild Card Round to fill the number 8 position in that round. The top two money winners from the Wild Card Round will advance to one of the semi-finals performances. No previous times or scores will be carried forward. The qualifiers for the two semi-finals performances will be seeded as follows: Semi-Finals number one (performance 16): #1 money winners including ground money from brackets 1, 3, 5, 7 and the #2 money winners from brackets 2, 4, 6 and the Wild Card round. Semi-Finals number two (performance 17): #1 money winners including ground money from brackets 2, 4, 6 and the Wild Card round, and the #2 money winners from 1, 3, 5, and 7. The actual competition order will be drawn randomly. Qualifying contestants or teams will have until 30 minutes following the end of the 7th bracket to trade. Wild Card qualifiers will have 30 minutes after that

performance to trade. No previous times or scores will be carried forward. From the semi-finals, the top 4 contestants or teams per performance based on fastest times and highest scores will advance to the finals (8 total). the finals (performance 18) will consist of 8 contestants or teams. The event champion will be determined by the highest score or fastest time in the finals. No previous times or scores will be carried forward.

TIES - For advancement purposes only. If there is a tie in the bracket, Wild Card, or Semi-Finals, it will be broken by any¹single fastest time or highest score in any round in the bracket. If still tied, the tie will be broken by any²round winner in the bracket. If still tied, the tie will be broken based on the³highest amount of money earned in the previous year's PRCA World Standings. If there is a tie in the Finals for event champion, co-champions will be awarded. Ties for pay-out will be treated as such and split evenly among the tied contestants or teams in all brackets and rounds.

REPLACEMENTS: ALL EVENTS - If a contestant who is entered in any of the brackets turns-out (includes DR's and VIR's) through PROCOM prior to, during or after their first competition performance, the position will be filled with the next qualified alternate.** All non-notified turnouts will be replaced with the next available contestant.** If a contestant who advances to the Wild Card turns-out (includes DR's and VIR's), the contestant that has the next highest earnings at the Fort Worth Stock Show & Rodeo in that respective bracket will be placed in the available position in the Wild Card (drop down until filled). If the contestant who qualified for the Wild Card round in the 8th position, based on being the top money winner from the pool of non-qualifiers, turns-out, the contestant who is the next highest ranked in that category will be accepted. If a contestant who has qualified for the semi-finals turns-out (includes DR's and VIR's), the contestant with the next highest score or fastest time from the Wild Card will advance to semi-finals (drop down until filled). If a contestant who advances from the semi-finals to the finals turns-out (includes DR's and VIR's), the contestant that has the next fastest time or highest score in the semi-finals will be placed in the available position in the finals (drop down until filled).

ALL EVENTS - If not enough contestants or teams record a qualifying time or score to fill the available positions from the brackets to the Wild Card round and/or Semi-Finals round, the available positions will be filled using the following criteria:¹most money won in the brackets, if still unable to fill,²fastest time or highest score in the brackets, if still unable to fill, the available positions will be filled based on the³ highest amount of money earned in the previous year's PRCA World Standings. If not enough contestants or teams record a qualifying time or score to fill the available positions from the Wild Card round to the Semi-Finals round, contestants or teams from the Wild Card round will advance based on the following criteria: ¹most money won in the brackets if still unable to fill, ²fastest time or highest score in the brackets, if still unable to fill, the available positions will be filled based on the highest amount of money earned in the previous year's PRCA World Standings. If not enough contestants or teams record a qualified time or score to fill the available positions from the Semi-Finals round to the Final round, contestants or teams from the Semi-Finals round will advance based on the following criteria:¹next qualified time or score in any performance of the Semi-Finals, if unable to fill, the contestant in the Semi-Finals with the most money won in the brackets, if still unable to fill, the³contestant in the Semi-Finals with the fastest time or highest score in the brackets, if still unable to fill, the available positions will be filled based on the contestant in the Semi-Finals with the highest amount of money earned in the previous year's PRCA World Standings. For purposes of selecting a champion, if no contestants or teams record a qualified time or score in any one event during the finals, the champion contestant or team will be determined by the most money including ground money won during the entire Fort Worth Stock Show & Rodeo.

ALL EVENTS: A contestant can draw and compete on an animal in the Semi-finals, the Wild Card Round, or the Finals that he previously competed on in his respective bracket.

ALL EVENTS - Any money won shall not count for Texas Circuit Standings or as a Texas Circuit participation count towards qualification for the Texas Circuit Finals Rodeo.

PAY-OFF - All events. No average. Pay-off for each round within the brackets: 1st - \$2,500 (per man in TR), 2nd - \$1,900 (per man in TR), 3rd - \$1,500(per man in TR), 4th \$1,000 (per man in TR), 5th through 8th \$125 (per man in TR). Pay-off for the 15th performance (Wild Card round): 1st - \$2,000 (per man in TR), 2nd - \$1,600 (per man in TR), 3rd \$1,100 (per man in TR), 4th - \$700 (per man in TR). Pay-off for the 16th and 17th performances (Semi-Finals rounds): 1st - \$4,000 (per man in TR), 2nd - \$3,000 (per man in TR), 3rd - \$2,000 (per man in TR), 4th - \$1,000 (per man in TR). Pay-off for the 18th performance (Finals round): 1st - \$20,000 (per man in TR), 2nd \$12,000 (per man in TR), 3rd - \$8,000 (per man in TR), 4th - \$4,000 (per man in TR).

ALL EVENTS - For the first 17 performances, if not enough contestants or teams qualify for the number of places to be paid in an event, the remaining places shall be divided evenly among those contestants or teams who did qualify (have a score or time), and that money will be considered ground money and will not be posted as Championship Points, and will not count towards qualifying for the National Finals Rodeo (except in the bull riding). In the finals, if there are not four qualified rides or times, the remaining placings will be paid out on the highest scores or fastest times in the Semi-Finals and all money paid out will count for championship points.

ALL EVENTS - Money will be divided equally in case of splits and any odd pennies will be dropped.

ALL CONTESTANTS - No entry, including contestants with back numbers, will be granted into the Rodeo arena beginning 1 hour prior to each round, no exceptions. All stock inspections must be performed in the arena pen area or timed event staging area. Contestant back numbers must be visible at all times to gain entry into the

bucking chutes, timed event staging areas, arena alleys/ staging area, rodeo arena and the Dickies Arena floor level. If the contestant is wearing a jacket or vest, the contestant back number must be pinned on the out of the jacket or vest, or the jacket or vest must be removed.

ALL EVENTS - Each contestant must complete a W-9 and submit the completed form to FWSSR officials prior to the contestant's first competition. FWSSR officials will not authorize payment of prize money to any contestant who does not have a valid W-9 on file with the FWSSR.
