PHASE 2: EASING OF TEMPORARY RESTRICTIONS

Dear CPST Residents:

The Board and Management wish to update you regarding the easing of various restrictions within CPST and the protocols and procedures associated with them.

CONTRACTORS & FURNITURE DELIVERY VENDORS WILL BE ALLOWED IN THE BUILDING BEGINNING TUESDAY, JUNE 9TH AT 8:30 AM SUBJECT TO SAME GENERAL AND SPECIFIC RESTRICTIONS:

GENERAL RESTRICTIONS ARE:

- All individuals seeking to enter the building are required to fill out and sign a screening protocol and release document at Receiving.
- In addition, they must agree to have their temperature taken by a non-contact thermometer
- A facial covering or a mask must be worn at all times in the common areas of the building. Note CPST cannot supply masks or facial coverings.
- Hands must be sanitized upon entering the building.
- After an individual successfully answers the questionnaire, signs the release and does not have a fever, they will be allowed to use the service elevator ONLY.

SPECIFIC RESTRICTIONS AS FOLLOWS:

CONTRACTORS & FURNITURE DELIVERY VENDORS

- Contractors and furniture delivery vendors may only enter through Receiving during the hours of 8:30 am – 5 pm, **Monday through Friday ONLY**.
- **Vendor or furniture delivery personnel must vacate the building by 5pm**.
- Anyone attempting to enter through Receiving without proper facial covering will be denied access to the building
- Must schedule vendors or deliveries in advance with the Receiving Clerk
- All insurance requirements must be met before a contractor or furniture delivery vendor will be permitted entry.

ALL OTHER CPST RULES AND RESTRICTIONS REMAIN IN EFFECT ESPECIALLY THE WEARING OF FACIAL COVERINGS OR MASKS IN ALL CPST COMMON AREAS.

We sincerely appreciate the cooperation of everyone who is a member of this community in support of the aforementioned restrictions.

If you have questions regarding the aforementioned requirements, or need assistance of any kind, please do not hesitate to contact a member of our Staff or the Management Office.

Please note that the number of COVID-19 cases in Palm Beach County are increasing not decreasing. Therefore, please evaluate your personal risk before allowing individuals from outside the building to enter your unit. As previously stated, although the Association cannot guarantee that the virus will not spread within our community, Management and the Board are taking many precautions in order to be as effective as possible in this current environment. It is up to each individual to protect themselves appropriately by following simple healthy practices such as those recommended by the CDC.
