

Guided Meditation/ Chanting: Experiments with Holy Name

To help Pittsburgh devotees improve the quality of japa meditation, ISKCON Pittsburgh held a guided meditation session. Shyamsundar Prabhuji took a one hour session of focussed methods to train our mind into deep levels of chanting. Japa chanting is a type of mantra meditation which is the easiest to be performed in Kali-yuga.

Two tips that prabhuji shared in the session were

- -Chant with Faith
- -Write the holy name on paper and focus on the impression.

Weekly Saturday Program

The year started with the new session of Sanskul classes and fresh and super enthusiastic Saturday programs. More than 30 families join ISKCON Pittsburgh Saturday programs held in St Brendan Church, Sewickly. These are a great stress- buster for families as they invoke peace and devotion through collective chanting 'kirtan'. The families build a close-knit connection with like-minded people and associate with devotees for collective enlightenment.

Together, celebrations of Mahashivratri (Blessed night of Lord Shiva), Makar Sankranti and many other festivities are done.

Sanskul classes by ISKCON Pittsburgh provide the appropriate Vedic knowledge to kids for their overall development. This helps the kids to stay connected with their cultural roots. Led by experienced and senior devotee teachers like Annadani Mataji for L2 and Srinivas Prabhuji for L1, the curriculum is designed to be engaging and accessible to young learners.
