- 05. (Roses) One cut, to be staged as cut from garden, with buds and leaves attached
- 06. (Cut Flowers) Definition of One Cut as cut from the garden, can include multiple heads. Cuts to be rhizomes, bulbs, corms or tubers, annuals or perennials, not shrubs or roses.
- **07. DISTINCT** means different colours or varieties
- 08. Shrubs and Natives: In all classes height not to exceed 40 cm above container
- 09. Green buds considered to be foliage
- 10. Prizes awarded to champion rose and aggregate points for roses, champion cut and aggregate points for cuts, champion shrub or native and aggregate points for shrub or native, champion pot plant and aggregate points for pot plant, champion floral arrangement, aggregate points for floral arrangement, overall aggregate points
- 11. All pots not to exceed 35cm
