"We can play outside!"

Today's school-age children are required to have a coat to be able enjoy outdoor activities when the temperatures drop below a certain degree. Unfortunately many children don't have the basics - much less a home to go back to or a guaranteed meal when they get there. Now imagine the additional social pressures that go along with being "different or without" and you can get a sense for what many children of poverty, abuse and neglect are experiencing.

I have always had a soft spot for children and as a father of two boys, I wanted to teach them the power of giving back. Living in a thriving Dallas suburb, you don't realize that the need is in your backyard. I founded McNeese Kids because of situations just like this. And I was proud to be able to donate over \$2,000 of coats, gloves and hygiene bags to a local Mesquite, Texas school who reached out. "We serve 560 students - close to 90% are lower socioeconomic class and 10 are homeless. Students that have their basic needs met can focus on their studies and feel confident...gain their dignity..and maybe avoid the teasing that comes with being different", said the school principal.

This is just one of many areas where McNeese Kids has been able to make an impact. McNeese Kids' mission is focused on helping children to be the best version of themselves and aligns around four core areas: Homelessness / Shelter, Abuse and Neglect / Safety, Hunger / Nutrition and Development / Esteem. Through creative fundraising and amazing donors and volunteers, McNeese Kids has been able to donate over \$200,000 to our three local partner charities: Jonathan's Place, Samaritan Inn and North Texas Food Bank. We have been able to rally volunteers to staff food packing assembly lines, sponsor an Angel Tree for the homeless - and even shop for every child!

And because we maintain a low 1.5% operating cost model with a nimble 100% volunteer staff, we are able to maximize the dollars that go to the children.

But there is more to do - and that's where you come in!

McNeese Kids is a 100% volunteer 501(c)3 non-for-profit organization. No board members or volunteers receive compensation, and all donations are 100% tax deductible according to the US Tax Code.

McNeese Kids distributes all funds raised, less expenses and operating costs to our partners and McNeese Kids Grant Program. As of December 2022, McNeese Kids has donated over \$200,000 to the children of the Dallas Metroplex.

McNeese Kids maintains a low 1.5% operating cost model – the bare minimum needed for administrative and operating costs.

McNeese Kids Expands its Mission to Help Children in Need November 23, 2022 | press

Dallas, Texas, Nov 23, 2022 / / - - McNeese Kids announced the creation of the McNeese Kids Grant Program and new pillar focused on a child's personal development and self-esteem.

The McNeese Kids Grant Program allows both individuals and organizations to apply for resource assistance on behalf of children struggling with hunger, homelessness, abuse/neglect or personal development and self-esteem issues. This fourth pillar will allow McNeese Kids to fund educational and recreational programs and the resources necessary for a child to participate.

"I have always had a soft spot for kids and a passion for giving back. And I have seen children going without the basics that they need to live – much less thrive. We founded McNeese Kids to address the issues in our own backyard," said Jim McNeese, Founder and President McNeese Kids.

McNeese Kids uses <u>Maslow's Hierarchy of Needs</u> to inform their areas of focus and have built relationships with three Dallas-based charities that align with the mission and share the board's values: <u>Jonathan's Place</u>, <u>Samaritan Inn</u> and <u>North Texas Food Bank</u>. Through individual and corporate sponsors, the McNeese Kids Annual Charity Golf Tournament and a modest 1.5% operating expense spend, McNeese Kids has been able to donate over \$200,000 in its first two years to these three organizations. And now with the expanded mission, McNeese Kids can respond to the immediate and urgent needs of the children of our community.

"We are proud to have been awarded the first McNeese Kids Grant. This donation provides us with coats, pants, beanies, gloves, scarves, and hygiene kits for homeless and in need children in the district this winter," said a teacher at the Dallas-area school.

In addition to funding, McNeese Kids helps to rally volunteers. With efforts like Christmas shopping for Jonathan's Place or food packing shifts at the North Texas Food Bank, McNeese Kids is hands on with its partners.

"Unfortunately, there will always be children who need our help. And as long as there is a need, there will be a McNeese Kids," said Jim McNeese.
