Kittens stay at the cattery until they are 12 weeks old and are fully vaccinated and examined by licensed Veterinarian Dr. Matthew Kelso @ Eudora Animal Hospital in Eudora Kansas. Kittens are also dewormed, microchipped, given 1 month of flea prevention, spayed or neutered. and tested for FeLV/FIV. All of my breeding program cats are DNA tested for over 49 different genetic abnormalities or defects to ensure that I minimize producing cats with genetic defects.
