Q #3	HOW DO YOU DOWNLOAD/UPLOAD DNA INFO OFF OF ANCESTRY?	MARIA BULLOCK
A #3	<p>ONCE YOU LOG INTO YOUR ACCOUNT, CLICK ON DNA AT THE TOP. THEN CLICK ON "YOUR DNA SUMMARY." GO ALL THE WAY TO THE RIGHT AND CLICK ON SETTINGS AND ON THE RIGHT SIDE OF THE PAGE YOU WILL SEE "DOWNLOAD RAW DATA." YOU WILL NEED TO RE-ENTER YOUR PASSWORD AND THE DOWNLOAD INSTRUCTIONS WILL BE SENT TO YOU AT THE EMAIL ADDRESS ASSOCIATED WITH YOU ACCOUNT. ONCE YOU RECEIVE THE EMAIL FOLLOW THE INSTRUCTIONS. ALSO, YOU CAN SEE THE JANUARY 12, 2019 PRESENTATION "GSGC GEDMATCH PRESENTATION" ON THE CLUB'S WEBSITE FOR A DETAILED EXPLANATION OF THIS.</p> <p>ALSO, YOU CAN GO TO ANCESTRY.COM, HELP, SUPPORT CENTER, SUPPORT TOPICS, "DOWNLOADING RAW DNA DATA." A #4	<p>THERE ARE SEVERAL WAYS TO HANDLE THIS SITUATION:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. ALWAYS CARRY A FLASH DRIVE TO SAVE DOCUMENTS/IMAGES FOUND DOING RESEARCH 2. "SAVE" TO THE COMPUTER - THIS PUTS THE INFORMATION (DOCUMENT/IMAGE) ON THE DESKTOP. THEN OPEN AN EMAIL SESSION AND ATTACH THE DOCUMENT/IMAGE FROM THE DESKTOP TO THE EMAIL AND SEND TO YOURSELF. 3. LASTLY, USE THE "SNIPPING TOOL", SNIP THE IMAGE AND PASTE IT INTO AN EMAIL TO YOURSELF. THE DOWNSIDE OF THIS APPROACH IS NOT BEING ABLE TO MODIFY THE IMAGE AS IS POSSIBLE IN #1 & 2 ABOVE.

NEITHER GEDSCAPE NOR TENSET TECHNOLOGIES LTD IS ASSOCIATED WITH THE CHURCH OF JESUS CHRIST OF LATTER-DAY SAINTS. THIS IS GENEALOGY SOFTWARE FOR THE MAC OS X. THE PROGRAM PROVIDES METHODS TO INPUT, MANIPULATE AND VIEW INFORMATION ABOUT A FAMILY HISTORY. IF USING SHEET PROTECTORS BE SURE TO BUY “EXTRA-WIDE DIVIDERS” WHICH CAN BE PURCHASED/ORDERED AT OFFICE DEPOT STORE (USE OUR ACCOUNT NUMBER FOR THE CREDIT TO THE CLUB); OTHERWISE THE DIVIDER TABS WON’T SHOW.</p> <p>ALSO FAMILY SEARCH. A #15	<p>BACK-UP HARD DRIVES ARE CURRENTLY AVAILABLE IN SIZES RANGING FROM 1 TERABYTE TO 6 TERABYTES (A TERABYTE IS 1,000 GIGABYTES). UNLESS YOU HAVE A TREMENDOUS AMOUNT OF DATA, A ONE TERABYTE DRIVE SHOULD BE SUFFICIENT. YOU CAN CHECK HOW MUCH DATA YOU CURRENTLY HAVE BY OPENING WINDOWS FILE MANAGER AND SEEING HOW MUCH OF THE C DRIVE YOU HAVE USED. EXTERNAL HARD DRIVES COME IN TWO TYPES; PORTABLE AND NON-PORTABLE. THE PORTABLE TYPE DERIVES ITS POWER FROM THE COMPUTER THAT IT IS CONNECTED TO AND DOESN'T REQUIRE AN EXTERNAL POWER SOURCE. MOST EXTERNAL HARD DRIVES COME WITH THEIR OWN SOFTWARE FOR CREATING BACK-UPS. THERE IS ALSO BACK-UP SOFTWARE INCLUDED WITH WINDOWS 10.</p>
