What's Next?

Supervised Instruction Permit (SIP) Requirements

- Hold your permit for 6 months, violation-free.*
- Always carry your permit while driving.
- Drive only with a licensed driver 21 years or older in the front passenger seat.
- Complete 50 supervised driving hours, including 10 hours at night (30 minutes after sunset to 30 minutes before sunrise).
- Everyone must wear seat belts and obey all traffic and state laws.
- If your permit is canceled due to traffic violations, you must obtain a new permit and restart the 6-month requirement.

Getting Your Driver's License

1. Complete Your Skills Test

Schedule with a state-approved examiner.

2. Visit the DMV

After passing your skills test, take the sealed envelope from your examiner to the DMV.
Once all requirements have been met, the DMV will issue your driver's license.

License Restrictions (Under Age 17)

- For the first 6 months, only one passenger under 17 who is not related by blood, marriage, or adoption is allowed.
- Drivers under 16 may not drive without an adult between 10:00 PM and 5:00 AM.
