

Academic Fraud and Dishonesty Policy

CTRTA expects all students to complete coursework, quizzes, exams, skills sheets, and practical evaluations with honesty, integrity, and professionalism. Academic fraud or dishonesty will not be tolerated in any CTRTA course.

Examples of Academic Fraud or Dishonesty

- Cheating on quizzes, exams, or practical evaluations.
- Copying another student's work or allowing another student to copy your work.
- Completing assignments, skills sheets, or written work for another student.
- Submitting work that is not your own.
- Falsifying attendance, skills completion, course records, or other documentation.
- Using unauthorized materials during testing or evaluations.
- Providing false information to instructors, proctors, or academy staff.
- Starting a quiz or exam, immediately submitting it to view the answers, and then retaking the quiz or exam in an attempt to obtain a passing score.

Possible Consequences

1. Removal from the testing or training session.
2. Invalidation of the assignment, quiz, exam, or skill.
3. Failure of the course.
4. Removal from the program.
5. Loss of eligibility for tuition-waived remedial training or future CTRTA courses.
6. Notification to the appropriate certifying or regulatory agency, if applicable.

CTRTA reserves the right to investigate suspected violations of this policy and make final determinations based on the facts of each case.
