## Acer 'Crimson Sentry'

A striking, upright maple with rich crimson-purple foliage that keeps its colour all summer. Compact and elegant, ideal for adding a bold accent to gardens or driveways.

### Quick Facts

- Height & Spread: 6–8m tall, 2–3m wide
- Time to Maturity: 10–20 years
- Interest: Crimson foliage spring-autumn, striking autumn colour

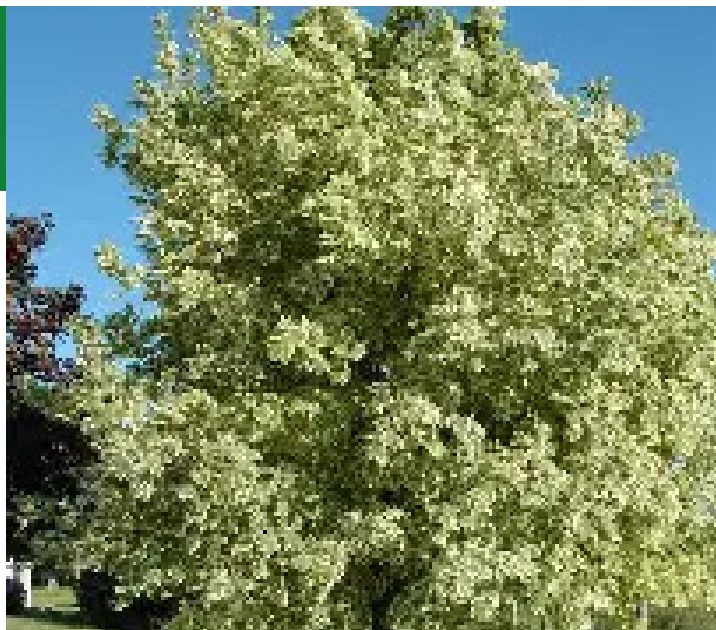


## Acer platanoides 'Drummondii'

A beautiful variegated Norway Maple with broad green leaves edged in creamy white. Its upright habit and showy foliage make it a standout shade tree that brightens any landscape.

- 🌸 Interest: Variegated foliage through summer, yellow autumn tones

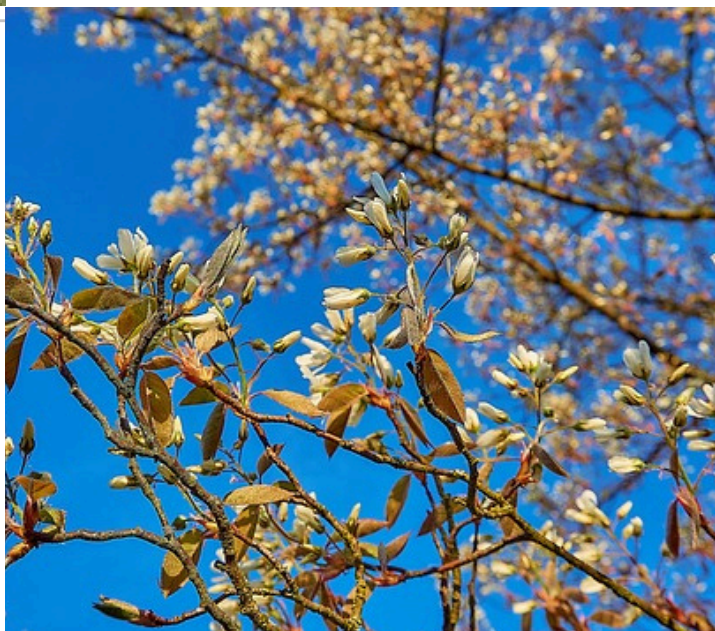


## Amelanchier lamarckii (Snowy Mespilus)

A four-season beauty: starry white blossom in spring, followed by edible berries in summer, fiery autumn foliage, and elegant winter form.

### Quick Facts

- Height & Spread: 6–8m tall, 4m wide
- Time to Maturity: 10–15 years
- Interest: Spring blossom, summer berries, orange-red autumn foliage



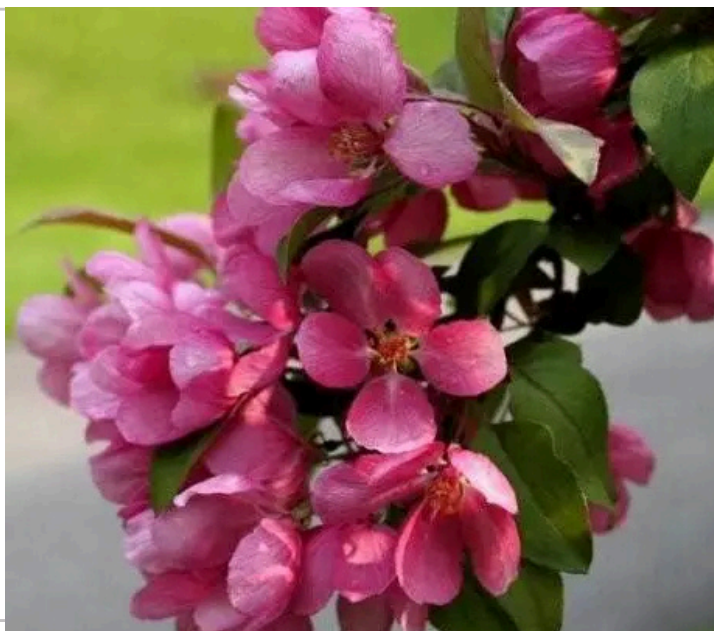


## Malus 'Ballerina'

A compact columnar crab apple with upright habit, making it perfect for narrow gardens. Masses of blossom in spring followed by colourful fruits in autumn.

### Quick Facts

- Height & Spread: 3-4m tall, 1-2m wide
- Time to Maturity: 8-12 years
- Interest: Spring blossom, autumn fruits for wildlife



## Amelanchier 'Robin Hill'

A refined ornamental tree with pink buds opening to pale blossoms, followed by berries for birds and bronzed autumn leaves. Upright form suits modern gardens.

### Quick Facts

- Height & Spread: 6-7m tall, 3-4m wide
- Time to Maturity: 10-15 years
- Interest: Spring blossom, edible berries, autumn colour

## Betula utilis 'Jacquemontii' (Himalayan Birch)

Famed for its brilliant white bark that glows year-round. Delicate foliage turns golden in autumn. Striking as a specimen or in groups.

### Quick Facts

- Height & Spread: 8-12m tall, 5m wide
- Time to Maturity: 15-20 years
- Interest: White bark year-round, golden autumn foliage





## Betula pendula 'Youngii' (Young's Weeping Birch)

A graceful weeping birch forming a dome of cascading branches. Beautiful over lawns or water features.

### Quick Facts

- Height & Spread: 5–7m tall, wide weeping canopy
- Time to Maturity: 10–15 years
- Interest: White bark, fresh green summer leaves, yellow autumn tones



## Cotoneaster (tree form)

Glossy green leaves, clusters of white flowers in spring, and masses of red berries in autumn/winter that birds adore. Hardy and reliable.

### Quick Facts

- Height & Spread: 3–4m tall, 2–3m wide
- Time to Maturity: 8–12 years
- Interest: Spring flowers, red berries into winter



## Crataegus laevigata 'Paul's Scarlet'

A tough, wildlife-friendly hawthorn with clusters of double scarlet flowers in late spring. Compact, colourful, and reliable.

### Quick Facts

- Height & Spread: 5–7m tall, 4–5m wide
- Time to Maturity: 10–15 years
- Interest: Scarlet spring blossom, red berries in autumn





## **Fagus sylvatica 'Purpurea'** **(Copper Beech)**

A majestic beech tree with deep purple foliage that turns rich copper in autumn. Makes a superb specimen or large garden feature, bringing drama and grandeur.

### Quick Facts

- Height & Spread: 20m+ tall, 12m wide (large tree)
- Time to Maturity: 30+ years
- Interest: Purple foliage spring-autumn, golden-copper tones in autumn



## **Liquidambar styraciflua** **'Worplesdon' (Sweet Gum)**

A reliable Liquidambar variety with deeply lobed leaves that blaze in orange, red, and purple each autumn. Strong pyramidal shape, ideal for autumn colour displays.

### Quick Facts

- Height & Spread: 12-15m tall, 6-8m wide
- Time to Maturity: 20-25 years
- Interest: Spectacular autumn foliage, upright form



## **Malus 'Crimson Cascade'**

A weeping crab apple with cascading branches smothered in crimson flowers, followed by red fruits that persist into winter. Excellent as a focal point.

### Quick Facts

- Height & Spread: 3-4m tall, 2-3m spread
- Time to Maturity: 8-12 years
- Interest: Crimson blossom in spring, red fruits in autumn/winter





## Malus 'Golden Hornet'

A compact crab apple with masses of fragrant blossom in spring, followed by clusters of bright yellow crab apples that persist into winter. Very wildlife-friendly.

### Quick Facts

- Height & Spread: 6–8m tall, 5m wide
- Time to Maturity: 10–15 years
- Interest: White spring blossom, golden fruits in autumn/winter



## Malus 'Profusion Improved'

A crab apple with deep pink blossom in spring and small red-purple fruits in autumn. Foliage often has bronze tints, adding extra seasonal colour.

### Quick Facts

- Height & Spread: 5–7m tall, 4–5m wide
- Time to Maturity: 10–15 years
- Interest: Pink spring blossom, bronze-tinted leaves, red fruits



## Prunus 'Accolade'

One of the finest cherries, producing semi-double pink flowers in early spring. A small to medium-sized tree, perfect for adding cheerful colour.

### Quick Facts

- Height & Spread: 6–8m tall, 5m wide
- Time to Maturity: 10–15 years
- Interest: Pink blossom in March–April, yellow-orange autumn colour





## Prunus 'Amanogawa' (Japanese Cherry)

A striking, narrow upright cherry with semi-double pink blossoms. Perfect for tight spaces, courtyards, or where height without spread is needed.

### Quick Facts

- Height & Spread: 6–8m tall, 2m wide (columnar habit)
- Time to Maturity: 10–15 years
- Interest: Pink blossom in late spring, upright form



## Prunus 'Fragrant Cloud'

A beautifully scented cherry with masses of fragrant pink flowers. A lovely ornamental tree that combines beauty with fragrance, ideal for garden focal points.

### Quick Facts

- Height & Spread: 5–7m tall, 4m wide
- Time to Maturity: 10–15 years
- Interest: Fragrant blossom in spring, autumn leaf colour

## Prunus 'Spire'

A columnar flowering cherry with clusters of single pink blossoms. A great choice where space is limited but vertical accent and spring colour are wanted.

### Quick Facts

- Height & Spread: 6–8m tall, 2–3m wide
- Time to Maturity: 10–15 years
- Interest: Pink blossom in April–May, upright habit





## Prunus 'Okame'

A small ornamental cherry, one of the earliest to flower. Produces masses of pink blossoms in March, followed by fresh green foliage. Compact and reliable.

### Quick Facts

- Height & Spread: 4–6m tall, 4m wide
- Time to Maturity: 8–12 years
- Interest: Early pink blossom (March), good autumn colour



## Pyrus salicifolia 'Pendula' (Weeping Silver Pear)

A graceful small tree with slender, silvery-grey leaves and elegant weeping branches. Its understated beauty makes it a refined choice for courtyards and lawns.

### Quick Facts

- Height & Spread: 4–6m tall, 3–4m spread
- Time to Maturity: 10–15 years
- Interest: Silvery foliage through summer, spring blossom



## Robinia pseudoacacia 'Frisia' (Golden Robinia)

A striking ornamental with bright golden-yellow foliage that glows against darker backgrounds. Light, open canopy makes it perfect for adding colour without heavy shade.

### Quick Facts

- Height & Spread: 8–12m tall, 6m wide
- Time to Maturity: 15–20 years
- Interest: Golden foliage spring–autumn, fragrant summer flowers





## Sorbus aria 'Lutescens' (Whitebeam)

A rounded tree with silvery-white young foliage that matures to green, followed by clusters of white flowers and orange-red berries. Reliable and tough.

### Quick Facts

- Height & Spread: 8–12m tall, 6–8m wide
- Time to Maturity: 15–20 years
- Interest: White spring flowers, berries in autumn, silvery spring foliage



## Sorbus 'Glendoick Wonder'

A decorative rowan tree with clusters of white flowers in spring, followed by pink-tinged berries and good autumn foliage colour. Compact and ornamental.

### Quick Facts

- Height & Spread: 6–8m tall, 4–5m wide
- Time to Maturity: 10–15 years
- Interest: Spring flowers, pink berries, autumn colour

## Sorbus vilmorinii 'Pink Pagoda'

A highly ornamental rowan with delicate, fern-like foliage. Bears clusters of white flowers followed by masses of pink berries in autumn.

### Quick Facts

- Height & Spread: 6–8m tall, 4–5m wide
- Time to Maturity: 10–15 years
- Interest: White flowers, pink berries, fiery autumn leaves





## Malus domestica 'Bramley' (Cooking Apple)

The classic British cooking apple. Produces large green fruits with sharp flavour, excellent for pies and sauces. Reliable blossom and heavy cropping.

### Quick Facts

- Height & Spread: 3–5m tall (on M26 rootstock)
- Time to Maturity: 3–5 years for first fruits
- Interest: White-pink blossom in spring, apples in autumn



## Malus domestica 'Charles Ross'

A dual-purpose apple, sweet enough for eating but also good for cooking. Large fruits with red-orange flush and sweet flavour.

### Quick Facts

- Height & Spread: 3–4m tall
- Time to Maturity: 3–5 years for fruiting
- Interest: Spring blossom, harvest in September



## Malus domestica 'Discovery'

One of the earliest eating apples, producing bright red fruits with crisp, juicy flesh. Sweet and refreshing flavour, excellent straight from the tree.

### Quick Facts

- Height & Spread: 3–4m tall
- Time to Maturity: 3–5 years for fruiting
- Interest: Blossom in April, fruit in August–September





## Malus domestica 'James Grieve'

A traditional Scottish apple variety. Produces juicy fruits with sharp flavour, good for eating or cooking. Crops well and grows reliably in UK gardens.

### Quick Facts

- Height & Spread: 3-4m tall
- Time to Maturity: 3-5 years for fruiting
- Interest: Blossom in spring, fruit in September



## Malus domestica 'Spartan'

A dessert apple with deep red skin and crisp, sweet white flesh. Compact growth habit makes it suitable for smaller gardens.

### Quick Facts

- Height & Spread: 3-4m tall
- Time to Maturity: 3-5 years for fruiting
- Interest: Blossom in spring, fruit October-November



## Malus domestica 'Cox's Orange Pippin' (on M26 rootstock)

One of the finest dessert apples, renowned for its rich aromatic flavour. Compact growth on M26 rootstock makes it perfect for home gardens.

### Quick Facts

- Height & Spread: 3-4m tall
- Time to Maturity: 3-5 years for fruiting
- Interest: Blossom in spring, apples ready late September-October





## **Malus domestica 'Sunset'** **(on M26 rootstock)**

A reliable garden apple, often described as a smaller, easier-growing alternative to Cox's Orange Pippin. Produces sweet, aromatic fruits.

### Quick Facts

- Height & Spread: 3-4m tall
- Time to Maturity: 3-5 years for fruiting
- Interest: Blossom in spring, fruits September-October



## **Prunus cerasus 'Morello'** **(Morello Cherry)**

A compact cherry tree producing dark red, sour cherries perfect for cooking, jams, and preserves. Crops well even in cooler areas.

### Quick Facts

- Height & Spread: 3-4m tall
- Time to Maturity: 3-5 years for fruiting
- Interest: White blossom in spring, cherries in July-August



## **Prunus avium 'Stella'** **(Sweet Cherry)**

A self-fertile cherry variety that produces heavy crops of large, dark red, sweet cherries. A great choice for gardens.

### Quick Facts

- Height & Spread: 3-5m tall
- Time to Maturity: 3-5 years for fruiting
- Interest: White blossom in spring, cherries in July





## Morus alba (White Mulberry)

A vigorous tree with broad leaves, often grown as a specimen. Can produce pale pink to white mulberries, though more often planted ornamentally.

### Quick Facts

- Height & Spread: 8–12m tall, 6–8m wide
- Time to Maturity: 15–20 years
- Interest: Glossy green foliage, occasional fruit in late summer



## Pyrus communis 'Conference' (Pear)

One of the UK's most popular pear varieties. Produces long, green fruits with sweet, juicy flesh. Reliable and heavy cropping.

### Quick Facts

- Height & Spread: 3–5m tall
- Time to Maturity: 3–5 years for fruiting
- Interest: White spring blossom, pears ready September–October



## Pyrus communis 'Williams Bon Chrétien' (Williams Pear)

A classic dessert pear, producing golden yellow fruits with sweet, aromatic flavour. Best picked in late summer.

### Quick Facts

- Height & Spread: 3–5m tall
- Time to Maturity: 3–5 years for fruiting
- Interest: Blossom in spring, pears in August–September





## Prunus domestica 'Golden Gage'

A gage plum with yellow-golden fruits that are rich, sweet, and full of flavour. A superb dessert fruit.

### Quick Facts

- Height & Spread: 3-4m tall
- Time to Maturity: 3-5 years for fruiting
- Interest: Blossom in spring, gages in August-September



## Prunus domestica 'Victoria'

The nation's favourite plum. Produces heavy crops of large red-purple fruits with yellow flesh. Reliable, hardy, and perfect for eating fresh or cooking.

### Quick Facts

- Height & Spread: 3-4m tall
- Time to Maturity: 3-5 years for fruiting
- Interest: Blossom in spring, plums in August-September



## Malus Family Apple Tree

A grafted tree carrying several different apple varieties on one tree, allowing extended harvest from early to late season. Perfect for smaller gardens.

### Quick Facts

- Height & Spread: 3-4m tall
- Time to Maturity: 3-5 years for fruiting
- Interest: Mixed apple varieties, blossom in spring, fruit summer-autumn





## Pyrus Family Pear Tree

A grafted pear tree producing multiple varieties on one plant, providing a succession of pears through the season. Great for limited space.

### Quick Facts

- Height & Spread: 3-4m tall
- Time to Maturity: 3-5 years for fruiting
- Interest: White spring blossom, mixed pears August-October

### Planting Tips

- Prepare the ground well — dig a generous hole, breaking up the soil and mixing in compost.
- Plant at the same depth the tree was growing in its container.
- Stake young trees securely to protect against wind rock.
- Water regularly during the first couple of years while the tree establishes.
- Mulch around the base with bark or compost to conserve moisture and suppress weeds.

A little care in the first few years will help your new tree thrive for decades to come.
