When you think of large displacement naturally aspirated engines that came out of Detroit, most folks will think of the Chevy 454 LS6 big block engine, the Pontiac-Buick-Olds 455 V8s, the Ford 429 Cobra Jet, the Chrysler 440 and 426 Hemi. Some may even recall the Cadillac 472 and 500 engines. Most will never mention the GMC Twin Six 702 or the GMC 637, probably because they've never seen or heard of them.

Starting in 1959 and going thru 1974, GMC produced a wide range of their own unique V6 engines. These 60-degree engines ranged in displacement from in 305, 351, 401, and 478-cubic-inch (5.0, 5.8, 6.6, and 7.8 liters respectively), with considerable parts commonality among them. During the latter years of production, 379-and-432-cubic-inch (6.2 and 7.1 L) versions with enlarged crankshaft journals, were manufactured as well. The GMC 637 was essentially a 478 V6 with two more cylinders added on. This came out to exactly 637.002 cubic inches.

The 637 produced 275 HP @ 2800 rpm and 600 lbs. ft. of torque @ 1600 rpm. The 637 was hardly dainty at 1,219 lbs., but it was considerably lighter than the Twin Six 702 it replaced, which tipped the scales at nearly



1,500 lbs. fully dressed.

Since the 637 shared the V's6 architecture's 60-degree vee angle, a less than optimal arrangement for a V8, a single balance shaft was used to make the engine smooth enough for truck use. The V8 also departed from its V6 sibling in its combustion chamber design, employing a flat deck and a pocketed piston crown, similar to diesel practice and a little like

The compression ratio was 7.5:1, while the airfuel mixture was fed by a single Bendix-Stromberg WW 2-barrel carburetor.

The 637 was installed in heavy duty trucks and buses. The 637 was the largest-displacement production gasoline V8 ever made for highway trucks. The 637 shares the 478's 5.125 in × 3.86 in (130.2 mm × 98.0 mm) bore and stroke using a single camshaft. Spark plugs were located on the inboard side of the cylinder heads and were accessed from the top of the engine. This position allowed for shorter spark-plug wires and kept the spark plugs away from the hot exhaust manifolds, something which was emphasized in GMC's sales literature. It was also perceived as being easier to access for maintenance. Power was listed as 275 HP @ 2800 rpm: torque 600 lbs. ft. @ 1600 rpm. The engine used a single 2barrel carburetor for fuel economy purposes, there was never a 4-bbl version. Production started in 1967 and went through 1972.

The 637's bore/stroke ratio is 1.33. This means that this is an over square engine, or a short-stroke engine. A square engine is when the bore/stroke ratio is 1:1.




Above: A 305 V6 showing how the spark plugs are located next to the intake manifold for easier maintenance.

When the bore/stroke ratio is less than 1:1, it is a under squire or long stroke engine. An oversquare engine allows for more and/or larger valves in the head of the cylinder, higher possible rpm by lowering maximum piston speed, and lower crank stress due to the lower peak piston acceleration for the same engine (rotational) speed.


The reduced stroke length allows for a shorter cylinder and sometimes a shorter connecting rod, generally making oversquare engines less tall but wider than undersquare engines of similar engine displacement. GMC selected this ratio to reduce piston speed and minimize frictional losses.

The ultimate version of the 637 V8 was the DH637 twin-turbocharged diesel version, which used a pair of turbochargers (labeled no. 9 in the illustration below) feeding a common plenum chamber (no. 4).



Output was a rated 220 gross hp at the governor -controlled maximum speed of 2800 rpm, with 458 lb.-ft of torque available at 2,000 rpm. This engine may have inspired Oldsmobile to create a diesel variant of there gasoline engine later in the 1970s.


