





WILLIAM LEE PORTER, JR. OBITUARY

Detroit Automotive Designer, Teacher of Industrial Design, Automotive Design and Design History, Lecturer, and Collector of Arts & Crafts Antiques, passed away peacefully on April 25, 2025 in his Whitmore Lake MI home surrounded by his wife, family and loved ones.



Bill was born May 6, 1931 in Louisville KY. As a precocious artistic

child with an early interest in automobiles and airplanes, William L. Porter graduated from DuPont Manual High School before completing his Bachelor of Arts at the University of Louisville, majoring in Painting & Art History with a minor in psychology and honored with membership in the Phi Kappa Phi and Woodcock honor societies. He was drafted into the US Army during the Korean War, where his minor in psychology credentialed him for interviewing and placing new recruits into diverse Army divisions.

Bill had a 37-year career as an automobile designer for General Motors. Starting in 1962 as the Assistant Chief Designer of the Preliminary Design Studio, in 1963 he became the Acting Chief Designer of the Development Studio.

WILLIAM LEE PORTER, JR. OBITUARY

Among the side projects of that era was an aerodynamic rear-engine dragster initiative, the first of its kind, that was abandoned when General Motors disassociated itself from automobile racing. In 1964, Bill was promoted to Chief Designer of the Design Development Studio and in 1965, became Chief Designer of Advance Design Studio #2. As Chief Designer at the Pontiac 1 Studio from 1968-1972, Bill's contributions include the 1969 GTO Judge and the 2nd-generation Firebird Trans Am that debuted in 1970; these cars are prized by automotive enthusiasts today. As Chief Designer of the Advance Pontiac Studio from 1972 to 1980, Bill led a team responsible for the development of concept-car and pre-production designs, including the body form of the 3rd generation Firebird/ Camaro that debuted in 1982. He accepted the position of Chief Designer for Buick in 1980, which he held until his retirement in 1996.


