- Grapevine is no longer able to support itself solely through subscriptions and literature sales. As a result, it is considering reducing the number of monthly issues it releases. Additionally, they will be selling event cards on a trial basis.
- Abbotsford won the bid to the WRAASA regional forum in 2027.

Turning to another matter, I was approached by a member of the now-defunct Miracle Beach Campout committee to facilitate the retrieval and redistribution of remaining funds.
