The 9474 foundation exists by God's grace to honor the life of Phil Taylor, who lived 9,474 days on earth prior to having colon cancer end his earthly life.

Phil graduated from Orange Lutheran High School in Orange, Calif., before moving to Fort Worth, Texas, to study sports broadcasting and play football at Texas Christian University.



Shortly after graduation, Phil coached at Prince of Peace Christian School in Carrollton, Texas. During his battle with colon cancer, Phil's positive outlook and personal passion to assist others carried into various doctors'offices and treatment facilities. His attitude and effort were evident to all around him and, through his relationships, as he strove to do his best in any situation.

football and baseball.
