WHEREAS, the Village of Belle Center is planning to make capital improvements to Center Street from Rt. 273 to Maple Street and N. Elizabeth Street from School Street to Rt. 273.


WHEREAS, the infrastructure improvement herein above described is considered to be a priority need for the community and is a qualified project under the OPWC program,

ORDINANCE NO. 2009-05

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING AN IDENTITY THEFT PREVENTION PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the Village of Belle Center deems it necessary to adopt an Identity Theft Prevention Program.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by Legislative Authority of the Village of Belle Center, Ohio, three-fourths (3/4) of its members concurring that:

SECTION I

The following Identify Theft Prevention Program shall be adopted, to wit;

Identify relevant red flags for covered accounts it offers or maintains and incorporate those red flags into the program;

Detect red flags that have been incorporated into the Program;

Respond appropriately to any red flags that are detected to prevent and mitigate identity theft; and

Ensure the Program is updated periodically to reflect changes in risks to customers and to the safety and soundness of the creditor from identity theft.

The program shall, as appropriate, incorporate existing policies and procedures that control reasonably foreseeable risks.

Administration of Program

Belle Center Village Council shall be responsible for the development, implementation, oversight and continued administration of the Program.

The program shall train staff, as necessary, to effectively implement the Program; and

The Program shall exercise appropriate and effective oversight of service provider arrangements.

Identification of Relevant Red Flags

The Program shall include relevant red flags from the following categories as appropriate:

Alerts, notifications, or other warnings received from consumer reporting agencies or service providers, such as fraud detection services;

The presentation of suspicious documents;

The presentation of suspicious personal identifying information;

The unusual use of, or other suspicious activity related to, a covered account; and

Notice from customers, victims of identity theft, law enforcement authorities, or other persons regarding possible identity theft in connection with covered accounts.

2. The Program shall consider the following risk factors in identifying relevant red flags for covered accounts as appropriate:

The types of covered accounts offered or maintained;

The methods provided to open covered accounts;

The methods provided to access covered accounts; and

Its previous experience with identity theft.

3. The Program shall incorporate relevant red flags from sources such as:

Incidents of identity theft previously experienced

Methods of identity theft that reflect changes in risk; and

Applicable supervisory guidance.

Detection of Red Flags

The Program shall address the detection of red flags in connection with the opening of covered accounts and existing covered accounts, such as by:

Obtaining identifying information about, and verifying the identity of, a person opening a covered account; and

Authenticating customers, monitoring transactions, and verifying the validity of change of address requests in the case of existing covered accounts.

Response

The Program shall provide for appropriate responses to detected red flags to prevent and mitigate identity theft. The response shall be commensurate with the degree of risk posed. Appropriate responses may include:

- Monitor a covered account for evidence of identity theft;

- Contact the customer;

- Change any passwords, security codes or other security devices that permit access to a covered account;

- Reopen a covered account with a new account number;

- Not open a new covered account;

- Close a existing covered account;

- Notify law enforcement; or

- Determine no response is warranted under the particular circumstances.

Updating the Program

The Program shall be updated periodically to reflect changes in risks to customers or to the safety and soundness of the organization from identity theft based on factors such as:

- The experiences of the organization with identity theft;

- Changes in methods of identity theft;

- Changes in methods to detect, prevent and mitigate identity theft;

- Changes in the types of accounts that the organization offers or maintains;

- Changes in the business arrangements of the organization, including mergers, acquisitions, alliances, joint ventures and service provider arrangements.

Oversight of the Program

Oversight of the Program shall include:

- Assignment of specific responsibility for implementation of the Program;

- Review of reports prepared by staff regarding compliance; and

- Approval of material changes to the Program as necessary to address changing risks of identity theft.

2. Reports shall be prepared as follows:

Staff responsible for development, implementation and administration of the Program shall report to Belle Center Village Council at least annually on compliance by the organization with the Program.

The report shall address material matters related to the Program and evaluate issues such as:

The effectiveness of the policies and procedures in addressing the risk of identity theft in connection with the opening of covered accounts and with respect to existing covered accounts;

Service provider agreements;

Significant incidents involving identity theft and management's response; and

Recommendations for material changes to the Program.

Oversight of Service Provider Arrangements

The organization shall take steps to ensure that the activity of a service provider is conducted in accordance with reasonable policies and procedures designed to detect, prevent and mitigate the risk of identity theft whenever the organization engages a service provider to perform an activity in connection with one or more covered accounts.

Duties Regarding Address Discrepancies

The Village shall develop policies and procedures designed to enable the organization to form a reasonable belief that a credit report relates to the consumer for whom it was requested if the organization receives an notice of address discrepancy from a nationwide consumer reporting agency indicating the address given by the consumer differs from the address contained in the consumer report.

The Village may reasonably confirm that an address is accurate by any of the following means:

Verification of the address with the consumer;

Review of the organization's records;

Verification of the address through third-party sources; or

Other reasonable means.

If an accurate address is confirmed, the organization shall furnish the consumer's address to the nationwide consumer reporting agency from which it received the notice of address discrepancy if:

The Village establishes a continuing relationship with the consumer; and

The Village regularly and in the ordinary course of business, furnishes information to the consumer reporting agency.

SECTION 2

That this Ordinance shall take effect at the earliest time provided by law.

ORDINANCE 2009-04

AN ORDINANCE FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROVIDING AND REGULATION OF OPERATING GOLF CARTS ON THE STREETS WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF BELLE CENTER AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BELLE CENTER ,
STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. No person shall operate a “ golf cart” vehicle on the streets within The Village of Belle Center unless it has been inspected and approved by the Logan County Sheriff’s Office, or its designee, or by another agent designated by the State of Ohio or Village of Belle Center, for compliance with the applicable safety equipment requirements of the State of Ohio relative to motor vehicles. For purposes of this Section, “golf cart” means a motor vehicle that has not less than three wheels in contact with the ground, that has an unladen weight of less than one thousand eight hundred pounds, that is designed to be and is operated at not more than twenty miles per hour and that is designed to carry not more than six persons including the driver.

Section 2. The owner or operator of any golf cart shall be required to pay any reasonable fee charged in connection with inspection through the Logan County Sheriff’s Office , or its designee , or by another agent designated by the State of Ohio or Village of Belle Center. The Logan County Sheriff’s Office, or its designee , or by another agent designated by the State of Ohio or Village of Belle Center will provide the applicant with evidence acceptable to the State of Ohio Bureau of Motor Vehicles when a golf cart passes such inspection.

Section 3 . Compliance with this section shall be in addition to , rather than in lieu of , any applicable provisions of State law relative to the operation of motor vehicles , which shall include but not limited to liability insurance.

Section 4 . Whoever violates this Ordinance is guilty of of a misdemeanor.

Section 5 . That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety and welfare of the Village of Belle Center , and this Ordinance shall become immediately effective upon receiving the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council and approval of the Mayor , otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

A ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OF THE VILLAGE
BELLE CENTER TO EXECUTE AN ENCROACHMENT EASEMENT AND
DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, it was brought to the attention of the Village of Belle Center that there is currently an encroachment over an alley between lots 6 & 7 of the Belle Center Original Plat as recorded in plat Cabinet "A" Slide 104 of the Village of Belle Center.

And

WHEREAS, the Village of Belle Center has been requested to grant an encroachment easement and the Village of Belle Center deems that said easement should be granted.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by Council of the Village of Belle Center, Ohio, three-fourths (3/4) of its members concurring that:

1. The Encroachment Easement attached hereto and marked as Exhibit "A" is hereby approved.

2. The Mayor of the Village of Belle Center is hereby authorized to execute said encroachment easement upon the passage of this resolution.

3. This ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the Village. The Ordinance is effective immediately upon its adoption.

ENCROACHMENT EASEMENT

The Village of Belle Center, Ohio, hereinafter Grantor, for valuable consideration paid grants to ROGER LEE LEUGERS and KIMBERLY K. LEUGERS, their heirs, successors and assigns, hereinafter referred as Grantee, an easement over the following described real estate, to wit:

SEE EXHIBIT 'A' ATTACHED HERETO

The intent of the above described description is to grant to the grantees an easement for the encroachment described above and as depicted on Exhibit "B" attached hereto.

This easement shall terminate automatically when the encroachment, or any portion there, no longer continues to exist upon the Grantor's land, for any reason whatsoever, including without limitation the demolition or destruction of the building, or any portion thereof, by any cause.

As part of the consideration for this Easement, the Grantor and Grantee agree: (1) that this easement is not intended to be an easement for public use and the Grantee agrees that neither their or their heirs, personal representative, successors and assigns shall take any steps necessary to dedicated this easement to the public use; (2) that the Grantee shall not take any steps necessary to obtain legal Title to the land described herein through adverse possession; (3) the Grantee shall pay all costs of repairing the building and maintaining the building in the same or better condition as it exists today; and (4) that all of the rights, terms, obligations and conditions of this Easement shall run with the land during the term of this Easement and shall be binding upon the inure to the benefit of Grantor and Grantee, their respective heirs, personal representatives, successors and assigns, including without limitations, all of the future owners of Grantor's parcel and Grantee's parcel.

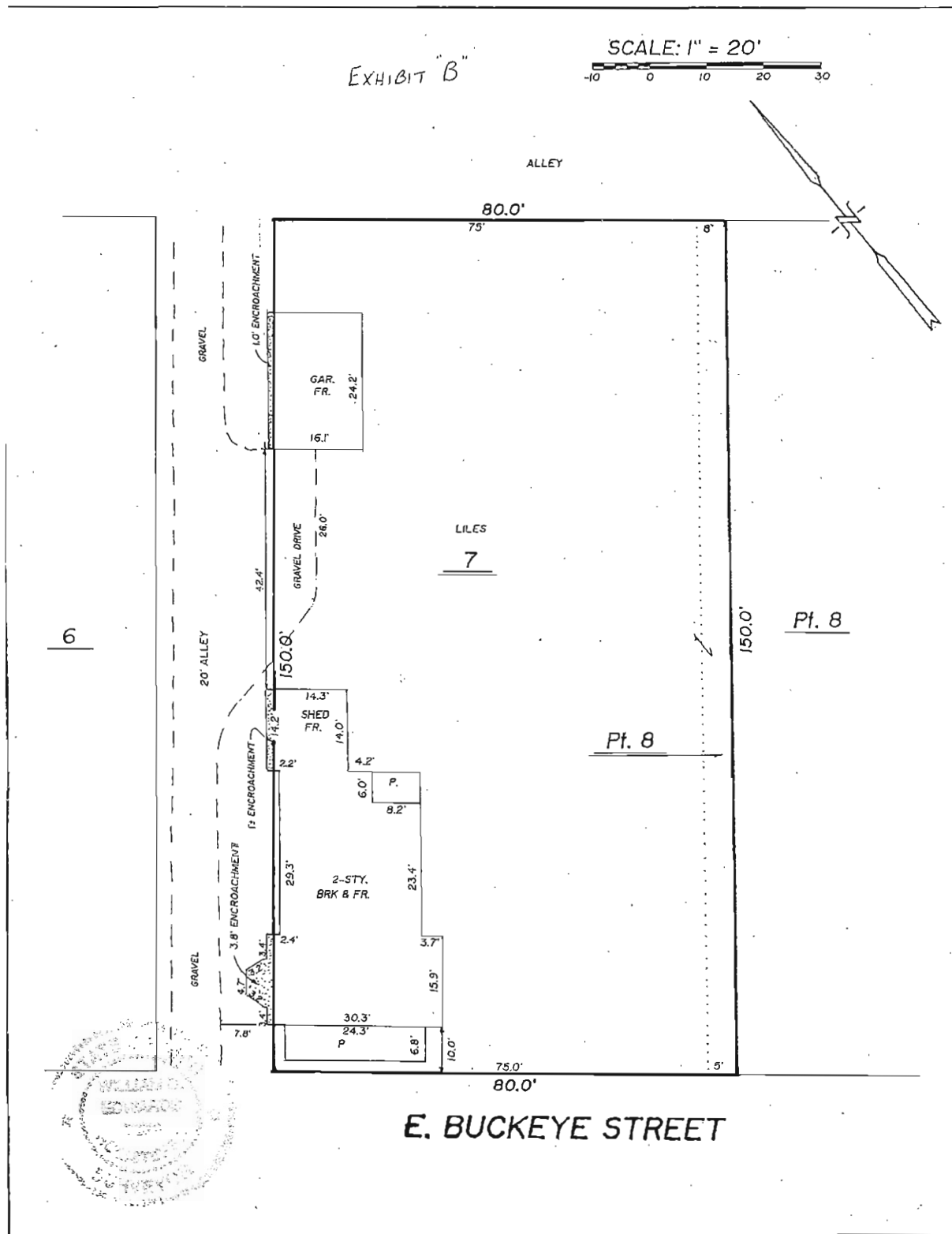

ORDINANCE 2009-02

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A VIDEO SERVICE PROVIDER FEE TO BE PAID BY ANY VIDEO SERVICE PROVIDER OFFERING VIDEO SERVICE IN THE VILLAGE; AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO GIVE NOTICE TO THE VIDEO SERVICE PROVIDER OF THE VIDEO SERVICE PROVIDER FEE ; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS , the Ohio General Assembly enacted Sections 1332.21 through 1332.34 of the Ohio Revised Code , effective September 24 , 2007 , to provide a statewide “ uniform regulatory framework “ for the provision of cable television and/or other video service (the “ Video Law “) and

WHEREAS , under the Video Law a video service provider that is providing video service to subscribers in the Village pursuant to a state-issued video service authorization must pay the Village a video service provider fee (VSP Fee “) based on a percentage of the provider’s gross revenues received from providing video service in the Village not to exceed five percent (5%) of such gross revenues: and

WHEREAS , the Video Law requires that the percentage of gross revenues on which VSP Fees are paid must be the same as the percentage of gross revenues that a cable operator pays pursuant to a franchise agreement that is in effect in the Village (the VSP Fee Percentage”) or , if there is no effective franchise agreement under which franchise fees are payable for a given quarter , the VSP Fee percentage shall be zero percent (0 %) of gross revenues unless the Village determines by Ordinance that the VSP Fee will be a percentage of gross revenues not to exceed five percent (5%) of gross revenues; and

WHEREAS , the Video Law further requires the Village to provide a video service provider with written notice of the VSP Fee percentage within ten (10) days of receiving notice from the video service provider , pursuant to R.C. 1332.27(A), that it will begin offering service in the Village; and

WHEREAS , in order to provide timely notice to a video service provider of the VSP Fee Percentage it is necessary for this Council (i) to establish the VSP Fee Percentage to a video service provider within ten (10) days of the Village receiving notice that a video service provider will begin providing service in the Village.

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF BELLE CENTER ,
STATE OF OHIO:**

Section 1. That this Council of the Village of Belle Center hereby establishes a VSP Fee that is calculated by applying a VSP Fee Percentage of three percent (3 %) to the Video service provider’s gross revenues as defined in Section

1332.32 (B) of the Video Law. All video service providers and cable television operators providing video service in the Village shall apply the VSP Fee percentage against gross revenues as defined in the Video Law.

Section 2. That the VSP Fee shall be paid by each video service provider providing service in the Village on a quarterly basis but not sooner than forty-five (45) days nor later than sixty (60) days after the end of each calendar quarter. R.C. 1332.32 (A)


Section 3 . That the Mayor is authorized and directed to provide any video service provider with notice of the VSP Fee Percentage as determined by this Council above , which notice shall be given by certified mail , upon receipt of notice from such video service provider that it will begin providing video service in the Village pursuant to a state-issued video service authorization.

Section 4 . That it is found and determined that all formal actions of the Council concerning and relating to the adoption of the Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council , and all deliberations of the Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

Section 5 . That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety and welfare of the Village of Belle Center , and this Ordinance shall become immediately effective upon receiving the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council and approval of the Mayor , otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

A RESOLUTION CONCERNING FLOOD PRONE AREAS & INTENT TO PARTICIPATE IN THE NATIONAL FLOOD INSURANCE PROGRAM

WHEREAS, certain areas of The Village of Belle Center are subject to periodic flooding, causing serious damages to properties within these areas; and

WHEREAS, relief is available in the form of Federally subsidized flood insurance as authorized by the National Flood Insurance Act of 1968; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of The Village of Belle Center Council to require the recognition and evaluation of flood hazards in all official actions relating to land use in areas having these hazards; and


WHEREAS, this body has the legal authority to adopt land use and control measures to reduce future flood losses pursuant to the Ohio Revised Code,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that The Village of Belle Center Council here:

1. Assures the Federal Emergency Management Agency that it will enact as necessary, and maintain in force in those areas having flood hazards, adequate land use and control measures with effective enforcement provisions consistent with the Criteria set forth in Section 60.3 of the National Flood Insurance Program Regulations; and
2. Vests The Village of Belle Center Council Member Dustin Plikerd with the responsibility, authority, and means to:
 - a. Assist the Administrator, at his request, in his delineation of the limits of the area having special flood hazards.
 - b. Provide such information as the Administrator may request concerning present uses and occupancy of the floodplain areas.
 - c. Cooperate with Federal, State, and local agencies and private firms that undertake to study, survey, map, and identify floodplain areas, and cooperate with neighboring communities with respect to management of adjoining floodplain areas in order to prevent aggravation of existing hazards.
 - d. Submit on the anniversary date of the community's initial eligibility an annual report to the Administrator on the progress made during the past year within the community in the development implementation of the floodplain management measures.

- e. Upon occurrence, notify the Administrator in writing whenever the boundaries of the community have been modified by annexation or the community has otherwise assumed or no longer has authority to adopt and enforce floodplain management regulations for a particular area. In order that all Flood Hazard Boundary Maps and Flood Insurance Rate maps accurately represent the community's boundaries, include within such notification a copy of a map of the community suitable for reproduction, clearly delineating the new corporate limits or new area for which the community has assumed or relinquished floodplain management regulatory authority.
- 3. Appoints The Village of Belle Center Village Council Member Dustin Plikerd to maintain for public inspection and to furnish upon request for the determination of applicable flood insurance risk premium rates within all areas having special flood hazards identified on a Flood Hazard Boundary Map or Flood Insurance Rate Map, any certificates of floodproofing, and information on the elevation (in relation to mean sea level) of the level of the lowest floor (including basement) of all new or substantially improved structures, and whether or not such structures contain a basement, and if the structure has been floodproofed the elevation (in relation to mean sea level) to which the structure was floodproofed:
- 4. Agrees to take such other official action as may be reasonably necessary to carry out the objectives of the program.





 - 4.) Bulk water purchasers shall be charged \$ 7.00 per thousand or any part thereof.
- Section II: A turn-on fee of \$ 10.00 shall be charged for turning on any water service.
- Section III: All non-property and property owners must pay a \$ 100.00 deposit before service is provided. Deposits paid by property owners shall be refunded in one year if the owner has paid off bills in a timely manner. Deposits to non-property owners shall be refunded upon moving out of the Village if all financial obligations to the Village have been satisfied.
- Section IV: Payments not made by the 15th. day of the following month shall be charged a late fee of 10 %, After sixty (60) days delinquent accounts may , at the option of the Fiscal Officer , be disconnected.
- Section V: All customers who have had service disconnected for non-payment shall be charged a \$ 25.00 fee during normal working hours or a \$ 50.00 fee after normal working hours to have service restored.
- Section VI: A \$ 30.00 fee is to be charged for all returned checks in addition to all bank charges to the Village.
- Section VII: That this Ordinance shall amend any prior ordinances setting water distribution and collection rates to the extent that they are in conflict
- Section VIII: This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure, made necessary to preserve the financial integrity of the Village of Belle Center and shall be in full effect with the water bills due to be paid in February , 2008.

AUTHORIZATION FOR THE VILLAGE OF BELLE CENTER TO PICK UP THE STATUTORILY REQUIRED CONTRIBUTION TO THE OHIO PUBLIC EMPLOYEES RETIREMENT SYSTEM FOR THE EMPLOYEES OF THE VILLAGE PURSUANT TO IRC SECTION 414(H)(2).

WHEREAS, Pursuant to federal and Ohio laws, the employees of the Village of Belle Center could defer the federal and state income taxes on a portion of their wages or salaries if the Village of Belle Center would "pick up" (assume and pay) the statutorily required contribution by such elected officials and covered employees to the Ohio Public Employees Retirement System (OPERS); and NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE VILLAGE OF BELLE CENTER OHIO, THAT:

SECTION 1: Effective January 1 , 2000 100 % of the statutorily required contributions to OPERS shall be picked up and paid as a fringe benefit by the Village for each person within any of the classes established in Section 2 herein. This "pick up" by the Village of Belle Center is, and shall be designated as, public employee contributions and shall be in lieu of contributions to OPERS by each person within any of the classes established in Section 2 herein. No person subject to this "pick up" shall have the option of choosing to receive the statutorily required contribution to OPERS directly instead of having it "picked up" by the Village of Belle Center or of being excluded from the "Pick up". The Village of Belle Center shall, in reporting and making remittance to OPERS report that the public employees contribution for each person subject to this "pick up" has been made as provided by the statute.

SECTION 2: The "pick up" by the Village of Belle Center provided by this Ordinance shall apply to the following positions: Village Administrator , Village Fiscal Officer , Village Income Tax Administrator , Village Solicitor and Village Utility Clerk.

SECTION 3: Under the Fringe Benefit Method of Employer pick-up, salary is not modified, however, the employer will pay 100 % of the employees, statutorily required 10.0% contribution to OPERS or the rate for employees in the future as set by OPERS

SECTION 4: The Fiscal Officer is hereby authorized and directed to implement the provisions of this Ordinance to institute the "pick up", of the statutorily required contributions to OPERS for those persons reflected in Section 2 herein so as to enable them to obtain the result in federal and state tax deferments and other benefits.

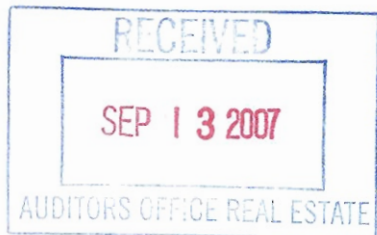

**AUTHORIZATION FOR PER CAPITA ASSESSMENT INCREASE
FUNDING THE LOGAN COUNTY EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY**

WHEREAS, there is an existing possibility of the occurrence of destruction resulting from natural or man-made disaster, or terrorist attack, and it is necessary to insure that preparations of this County will be adequate to deal with such disasters and generally to provide for the common defense, and to protect the public order, health, safety, and general welfare, and to preserve the lives and property of the people of Logan County; and

WHEREAS, Ohio Revised Code section 5502, as amended, requires every political subdivision to have an Emergency Management Agency to conduct required planning and training activities and to coordinate response and resource support to such major emergencies and disasters; and

WHEREAS, Logan County and all political subdivisions within determined to establish a single countywide agency to perform the necessary and required activities of emergency management, organized according to Ohio Revised Code section 5502.26, and adopted the Countywide Emergency Management Agreement on November 20, 1990 (Commissioners Resolution #537-90); and

WHEREAS, the Countywide Emergency Management Agreement established that the political subdivisions would support the agency through the collection of a per-capita assessment, and that said assessment would be withheld by the Auditor of Logan County at the time of the February settlement from the General Fund of each political subdivision; and

WHEREAS, the original assessment rate of \$.50 per capita from the municipalities and townships and \$.50 per capita from the County General Fund has been in place for seventeen (17) years, and the Director and Executive Committee have determined that the agency is no longer able to conduct the required functions of emergency management without an increase; and

WHEREAS, the Executive Committee has determined that an increase to \$.90 per capita from the municipalities and townships and \$.90 per capita from the County General Fund is necessary beginning with the February 2008 settlement, and that a \$.05 increase each three years thereafter is necessary to keep pace with inflation and to maintain financial stability for the agency; and

WHEREAS, the Executive Committee has determined that a review of the per capita assessment and financial status of the agency shall be done upon receipt of the official 10-year Census report, and that necessary adjustments, including an increase request or a temporary suspension of the three-year increase, will be presented to the Advisory Group for approval no later than June 30th prior to the affected settlement.

NOW, THEREFORE, we, The VILLAGE of BELLE CENTER COUNCIL

do hereby confirm that the Countywide Emergency Management Agreement shall remain in force; and we hereby authorize our representative to the Emergency Management Advisory Group to vote in favor of the following amendments:

1. Approve an increase to \$.90 per capita from the municipalities and townships and \$.90 per capita from the County General Fund for support and operation of the Logan County Emergency Management Agency; and that these funds shall be withheld by the Auditor of Logan County beginning with the February 2008 settlement and paid into the Logan County Emergency Management Fund; and
2. Authorize a \$.05 increase each three years thereafter and establish that the Executive Committee and the Director will conduct a review of the per capita assessment and financial status of the agency upon receipt of the official 10-year Census report, and agree that a temporary suspension of the three-year increase may be enacted if the review determines that it is not necessary.

These amendments shall be in force and effect when no less than a majority of the political subdivisions of Logan County and the County Commissioners of Logan County shall have subscribed to this agreement by adopting a like resolution or passing a like ordinance, and shall continue in full force and effect thereafter, unless and until terminated by the parties thereto. This agreement may be terminated at any time by mutual agreement of the parties hereto, and may be terminated by any party at the end of any calendar year by action of its legislative authority and service of written notice thereof on the Board of County Commissioners of Logan County and the Executive Committee not less than ninety (90) days prior to the end of said calendar year.

For the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof, this Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage by the Commissioners of Logan County, and its adoption by the respective legislative bodies of the majority of the other political subdivisions.

ORDINANCE NO. 2006-04

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING TO Mid Ohio Energy Cooperative, Inc., ITS SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS A FRANCHISE FOR THE DISTRIBUTION OF ELECTRIC POWER AND ENERGY TO PARTS OF THE VILLAGE OF BELLE CENTER, OHIO WHICH ARE PRESENTLY WITHIN SAID COMPANY'S SERVICE AREA AND FOR THE TRANSMISSION OF ELECTRICITY WITHIN SAID VILLAGE.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Village of Belle Center, State of Ohio:

SECTION I. That Mid Ohio Energy Cooperative, Inc., its successors and assigns (hereinafter called "Grantee") are hereby granted the right, privilege, franchise and authority to acquire, construct, maintain and operate in, above, under, across and along the streets, thoroughfares, alleys, bridges, and public places (as the same now exist or may hereafter be laid out) of the Village of Belle Center, State of Ohio, and its successors (hereinafter called "Village"), lines for the distribution of electric power and energy, either by means of overhead or underground conductors, with all the necessary or desirable appurtenances to render public utility service in the Village and to the inhabitants thereof by supplying electric power and energy to the Village and the inhabitants thereof, and to persons or corporations beyond the limits thereof, for light, heat, power or any other purposes or purpose for which electric power and energy is now or may hereafter be used, and the transmission of the same within, through or across the Village, provided, however, that Grantee shall provide electric service hereunder only within: (1) the area or areas of the Village either presently being provided electric service by Grantee, or at the date of this ordinance, included in the area shown on maps issued by the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio which indicate the certified territory of the Grantee established pursuant to Sections 4933.81 to 4933.90 of the Revised Code of Ohio, and (2) any other area or areas annexed to the Village after the date of this ordinance any portion of which is either being provided electric service by Grantee at the time of such annexation, or which at the date of this ordinance is included within the Grantee's aforementioned certified territory.

SECTION 2. That said lines and appurtenances shall be constructed so as to interfere as little as possible with the traveling public in its use of the streets, thoroughfares, alleys, bridges and public places of the Village. The location of all poles, or conduits, shall be made under such reasonable supervision the proper board of committee of the Village government, as is permitted by law.

SECTION 3. That the rights, privileges and franchise hereby granted shall be in force and effect for a period of twenty-five (25) years from the date of the passage of this ordinance.

That the rights, privileges and franchise hereby granted shall not be construed to be exclusive and the Council of the Village hereby reserves the power to grant similar rights, privileges and franchises to any other person or persons, firm or firms, corporation or corporations.

SECTION 4. That said Grantee shall save the Village harmless from any and all liability arising in any way from the Grantee's negligence in the erection, maintenance or operation of said lines for the distribution or transmission of electric power and energy.

SECTION 5. That whenever said Grantee shall begin the erection of any lines or equipment it shall promptly and diligently prosecute the work to completion and leave the streets, thoroughfares, alleys, bridges and public places where such work is done in as good condition of repair as before such work was commenced.

SECTION 6. That wherever in this ordinance, reference is made to the Village or Grantee, it shall be deemed to include the respective successors or assigns of either; and all rights,, privileges and obligations herein contained by or on behalf of said Village or by or on behalf of said Grantee, shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the respective successors or assigns of said Village or of said Grantee, whether so expressed or not.

SECTION 7. That this ordinance shall be accepted by the Grantee within sixty (60) days from the date of the passage of the same.

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE KEEPING OR HARBORING OF A LOUD DOG
OR DOGS AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, The legislative authority of the Village of Belle Center has deemed it necessary, in order to maintain the peace in the Village of Belle Center that an ordinance should be passed prohibiting the keeping or harboring of a loud dog or dogs.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the legislative authority of the Village of Belle Center, Ohio, three-fourths (3/4) of its members concurring that:

SECTION 1:

No owner, keeper, or harbinger of a dog shall permit or allow such dog to annoy or disturb one or more of the inhabitants of two or more separate residences of this municipality by the frequent or habitual howling, yelping, barking, or making of any other unreasonably loud and disturbing noises of such character, intensity, and duration as to disturb the peace, quiet and good order of the municipality. Any person who shall allow any animal habitually to remain, be lodged or fed within any dwelling, building, yard or enclosure owned or occupied by such person shall be considered as keeping or harboring such animal.

SECTION II:

Whoever violates this ordinance or any provisions thereof, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) and a term of imprisonment not exceeding thirty (30) days or both. A separate offense shall be deemed committed each day during or which a violation continues or occurs.

SECTION III:

This ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the Village. The Ordinance is effective immediately upon its adoption.

WHEREAS, President Bush issued Homeland Security Presidential Directive (HSPD)-5, *Management of Domestic Incidents*, on February 28, 2003, directing the Secretary of Homeland Security to develop, submit for review to the Homeland Security Council, and administer a National Incident Management System (NIMS); and

WHEREAS, Governor Taft issued Executive Order 2004-14T on July 30, 2004 ordering all departments and agencies of the State to utilize the Incident Management System prescribed by the Department of Homeland Security; and

WHEREAS, NIMS will provide a consistent nationwide approach allowing federal, state, local and tribal governments to work effectively and efficiently to prevent, prepare for, respond to, and recover from domestic incidents; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Homeland Security has sought extensive input on NIMS from state, local, and tribal officials, the emergency response community, and the private sector and has incorporated the best practices currently in use by incident managers; and

WHEREAS, effective homeland security incident management involves new concepts, processes, and protocols that will require refinement over time. The collective input and guidance from all homeland security partners has been, and will continue to be, vital to the further development of an effective and comprehensive national incident management system; and

WHEREAS, NIMS was published by the Department of Homeland Security on March 1, 2004; and

WHEREAS, HSPD-5 and NIMS require all federal departments and agencies to adopt NIMS and use it in domestic incident management and emergency prevention, preparedness, response, recovery, and mitigation programs and activities, as well as to assist state, local, or tribal entities; and

WHEREAS, HSPD-5 and NIMS require federal departments and agencies to make state, tribal and local organizations adopt NIMS as a condition for federal preparedness assistance beginning in federal fiscal year 2005; and

WHEREAS, short-term compliance will include adopting the basic tenets of the Incident Command System identified in the NIMS document. The Secretary of Homeland Security published standards, guidelines, and protocols for determining compliance in December 2004.

WHEREAS, the Board of Logan County Commissioners adopted NIMS on September 28, 2004 for all Logan County jurisdictions,

AN ORDINANCE PROMOTING AND PROTECTING THE PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY, AND GENERAL WELFARE BY PROVIDING FOR THE REGULATION OF PLANTING, MAINTENANCE AND REMOVAL OF TREES, SHRUBS, AND OTHER PLANTS WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF BELLE CENTER, WHICH ORDINANCE SHALL HEREINAFTER BE REFERRED TO AS THE TREE ORDINANCE.

Be it ordained by the Council of the Village of Belle Center, State of Ohio, two-thirds of all members elected thereto concurring:

SECTION 1: Definitions

As used in this Ordinance, the following definitions apply:

- A. "Person" means any person, firm, partnership, association, corporation, company, or organization of any kind.
- B. "Property Line" means the outer edge of a street or highway.
- C. "Property Owner" means the person owning such property as shown by the County Auditor's Plat of the Village of Belle Center, Logan County, Ohio.
- D. "Pruning" means to cut branches, stems, etc. from a plant to improve shape and/or growth.
- E. "Public Places" includes all grounds owned by the Village of Belle Center.
- F. "Public Trees" includes all shade and ornamental trees now or hereafter growing on any street or any public place.
- G. "Shrub" means a low-growing woody plant with one or more perennial main stems producing branches, shoots, or multiple stems from or near the base of the plant and incapable of being pruned to provide at least six feet of clear branchless trunk within five years of planting.
- H. "Small Tree" means any tree species which normally attains a full grown height under thirty feet.
- I. "Medium Tree" means any tree species which normally attains a full-grown height between thirty and fifty feet.
- J. "Large Tree" means any tree species which normally attains a full grown height over fifty feet.

- K. "Park Trees" are trees, shrubs, and all other woody vegetation in public parks and all areas owned by the Village of Belle Center, Ohio, or to which the public has free access as a park.
- L. "Street or Highway" means the entire width of every public way, easement or right-of-way when any part thereof is open to the use of the public, as a matter of right, for the purpose of vehicular and pedestrian traffic, and shall include alleys.
- M. "Street Trees" are trees, shrubs, and all other woody vegetation on land lying between property lines on either side of all streets, avenues, or are within the Village of Belle Center.
- N. "Topping" means the severe cutting back of limbs to stubs larger than three inches in diameter within the tree's crown to such a degree so as to remove the normal canopy and disfigure the tree.
- O. "Tree" means a tall growing woody plant with one or more perennial main stems or trunk which develops branches from the aerial section of the stem rather than the base; capable of being pruned to provide at least six feet of clear branchless trunk below the crown within five years of planting.
- P. "Tree lawn" means that part of a street or highway right-of-way outside of the portion improved for travel, including the sidewalk and lawn area between the sidewalk and contiguous street or highway.

SECTION 2: That there is hereby created and established a Landscape and Tree Commission for the Village of Belle Center. Said Commission shall consist of seven members: the Mayor of the Village of Belle Center, one council member, a representative of the Adarian Club, and four citizens who reside in either the Village of Belle Center or Richland Township. Members of the said Commission will be appointed by the Mayor with the approval of the Village Council and which members shall serve without compensation.

SECTION 3: That the duties of the Landscape and Tree Commission shall be to:

- (1) Make a study and determine the needs of the Village of Belle Center in connection with its tree planning program;
- (2) Recommend to the property authority the types and kinds of trees to be planted upon designated streets, parts of streets or parks of the Village.

- (3) Assist Village officials and citizens in the dissemination of news and information regarding the selection, planting, and maintenance of trees within the Village;
- (4) Provide regular and special meetings at which the subject of trees as it relates to the Village may be discussed by its members, Village officials, and others interested in the tree program.

SECTION 4: That this Ordinance provides full power and authority over all trees, plants, and shrubs located within the street right-of-way, parks and public places of the Village, and to trees, plants, and shrubs located on private property that constitute a hazard or threat to trees, plants and shrubs located in the areas described herein.

SECTION 5: That it shall be unlawful for any person to engage in the business of planting, cutting, trimming, pruning, removing, spraying or otherwise treating trees, shrubs or vines within the Village of Belle Center on street right-of-ways, parks and public places of the Village, without obtaining the proper permit from the Mayor of the Village of Belle Center, Ohio.

SECTION 6: That the Mayor of the Village of Belle Center, Ohio, is hereby authorized to issue permits, upon the approval of the Landscape and Tree Commission, to persons engaged in the business of planting, cutting, trimming, pruning, removing, spraying or otherwise treating trees, shrubs or vines within the Village of Belle Center, Ohio, on street right-of-ways, parks and public places of the Village. That no permit shall be issued prior to the applicant showing evidence of possession of worker's compensation and liability insurance in minimal amount of \$1,000,000.00 for bodily injury or death and \$100,000.00 property damage indemnifying the Village for any person injured or damaged resulting from the pursuit of such endeavor as herein described.

SECTION 7: That no person shall plant, remove, cut above the ground or disturb any tree on any street right-of-way, park or other public place without first filing for and procuring from the Landscape and Tree Commission written approval. It shall be unlawful for any person receiving such approval to violate any of the rules and/or regulations adopted by the Landscape and Tree Commission or any of the restrictions and/or conditions upon which said persons request for approval was granted.

SECTION 8: That upon the discovery of any destructive or communicable disease or other pestilence which endangers the growth or health of trees or threatens to spread disease or insect infestations, the Landscaping and Tree Commission shall at once cause written notice to be served upon the owner of the property upon which such diseased or infested tree is situated and the notice shall require such property owner to eradicate, remove or otherwise control such condition within reasonable time to be specified in such notice.

SECTION 9: That the Village of Belle Center Administrator, upon the recommendation of the Landscape and Tree Commission, has the authority to enter onto private property whereon there is located a tree, shrub, plant or plant part that is suspected to be a public nuisance and to order its removal if necessary. Public nuisance shall include but not be limited to any trees, plants, shrubs and/or vines located in any of the areas herein described which contain an infectious disease or insect problem; are dead or dying; obstruct street lights, traffic signs, the free passage of pedestrians or vehicles; or which otherwise poses a threat to the health, safety and welfare of the citizenry of the Village of Belle Center, Ohio.

SECTION 10: That any person who violates any provision of this Ordinance or who fails to comply with any notice issued pursuant to provision of this Ordinance, upon being found guilty of the violation, shall be subject to a fine of not less than \$25.00 and not more than \$500.00. Each day during which any violation of the provisions of the Ordinance shall occur or continue shall be a separate offense. If, as the result of the violation of any provision of this Ordinance, the injury, mutilation or death of a tree, shrub or other plant located on Village-owned property is caused, the cost of repair or replacement of such tree, shrub or other plant, shall be borne by the party in violation.

SECTION 11: No person shall make any excavation, place any fill, compact the soil, or construct any building, structure, street, sidewalk, driveway, pavement, or public utility within 15 feet of any public tree without first obtaining a permit for such work in accordance with such permit. Permits can be obtained by the Mayor of the Village of Belle Center.

SECTION 12: This Ordinance is hereby declared necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the inhabitants of the Village of Belle Center, Ohio, and for the further reason that it is necessary in order to promote and protect the public health, safety and welfare by providing for the regulation of planting, maintenance and removal of trees, shrubs and other plants within the Village.

Wherefore, this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the Village of Belle Center Council.

SECTION 2: Village employees or their authorized agent have the right , upon twenty four (24) hours notice, to enter the premises or business of any user of the sanitary sewer system to inspect the plumbing and the connection to that system, to perform any flow, pressure or smoke tests they deem necessary to determine whether an illegal connection exists.

SECTION 3: Should the Village employees or authorized agents inform a user of an illegal connection, the user shall at their sole expense, remedy such violation to the satisfaction of the village within ten working days.

SECTION 4 : If the user fails to comply with the requirements to correct the violation within ten working days, the Village shall impose a penalty of \$ 20.00 per day until said correction is completed to the satisfaction of the Village.



The LPA agrees that all utility accommodations, relocations and reimbursements will comply with the current provisions of 23 CFR 645 and the ODOT Utilities Manual.

SECTION I - Project Description

WHEREAS, the LPA has identified the need for the described project:

This project proposes to stabilize shoulders, repair and resurface the existing roadway and other roadway related items, from the junction of State Route 117 to the Belle Center East Corporation Limit.

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Village of Belle Center, Ohio.

SECTION II - Consent Statement

Being in the public interest, the LPA gives consent to the Director of Transportation to complete the above described project.
